

46 And, uh, I walked over, you know, and noticed that, you know, there's some  
47 dishes, so I grabbed some dishes, brought them up here. And there was a bag  
48 on the ground and it said ammo.

49  
50 Q: Okay.

51  
52 A: So me being nosey I kinda picked it up and looked at it and it said, like, P223  
53 or something and...

54  
55 A: Okay.

56  
57 Q: ...so I came up here and Googled it to see what it was and people were talking  
58 about, you know it's for their AR's and, you know and I didn't think anything  
59 of it, you know, just, like, oh maybe he's target shooting or something before  
60 he's leaving for Hawaii he want to live that experience that or something.

61  
62 Q: Okay.

63  
64 A: And, you know, then the shooting thing happened on TV and started thinking  
65 and I was like, you know, uh, you know just kind of being like oh that'd be  
66 crazy, you know, it's weird. And then I started just adding things up, people  
67 on the news were saying he was in all black and, you know, he had a white  
68 mask on and it just, I don't know, uh, I seen the ammo, I decided to sneak  
69 around a little bit more. Kinda got a little nosey after I already called you  
70 guys and, you know, we found multiple receipts, like, from Wal-Mart,  
71 Wholesale Sports for ammo, I mean, and like seven packages of ammo at a  
72 time and there's multiple receipts for it.

73  
74 Q: Okay.

75  
76 A: And, uh, there's bags for 50 round magazine clips down there.

77  
78 Q: Okay.

79  
80 A: Um, I don't know I just - looks like maybe a part of a holster's torn or cut off  
81 next to his laptop. Um, and then my girlfriend said that he went over to her  
82 mom's house to say - her brother's his best friend and they said he gave them  
83 a hug and gave them a bracelet and said, you know, he's leaving, um, said  
84 things went south or something and her brother asked him, you know, "Did  
85 you get kicked out?" My brother, you know, "Did Jaime and Chris kick you  
86 out?" He said, "No, not that." And looked a little teary eyed, I guess, and left  
87 and that was part of the reason why it made me wanna call you guys, just  
88 things just seemed kinda weird.

89

90 Q: Okay. Let me, uh, let me ask you some clarifying questions. Uh, number  
91 one, the incident we're talking about kinda the catalyst of it all was this, uh,  
92 shooting at the Clackamas Town Center, correct?  
93  
94 A: Correct.  
95  
96 Q: And then from there you called in, um, a tip in regards to...  
97  
98 A: Um, I think a little while later after I just - I mean it just started adding up. It  
99 kinda...  
100  
101 Q: Based on kind of how he was acting. With some of the things you found that  
102 you see the news report from the shooting at the Town Center, that's when  
103 you called in the tip, it kinda expressed these concerns that you had with your  
104 roommate.  
105  
106 A: Yes.  
107  
108 Q: And by your roommate by name can you tell me who we're talking about?  
109  
110 A: His name's Jake Tyler Roberts.  
111  
112 Q: Okay. I'm gonna go ahead and show you just a picture and you can tell me -  
113 it's a DMV photograph, you can tell me if this is the same person that we're  
114 talking about here.  
115  
116 A: Yeah, he has shorter hair now though.  
117  
118 Q: Okay, but the same person.  
119  
120 A: Yeah, yeah.  
121  
122 Q: But that's your roommate?  
123  
124 A: Yeah.  
125  
126 Q: Okay, and let's just do a little, uh - um, let's start from the beginning. How  
127 long have you known him?  
128  
129 A: Aw man, I've known him ever since I've been together with my girlfriend, so  
130 almost three years now.  
131  
132 Q: Okay and how long have you guys lived together?  
133

134 A: Um, you know what, I moved in - I lived at my parents' house when I first  
135 met Jaime, um, I moved into her parent's house for a little while.  
136  
137 Q: Okay.  
138  
139 A: Uh, he was still - he was the roommate that was living with her brother, he  
140 was living at the house.  
141  
142 Q1: He was Jaime's, uh, brother's roommate?  
143  
144 A: He - kinda, yeah, he lived at his - her parents' house. Um, you know, and then  
145 I've known him for a while. We had, you know, we lived here at this house  
146 first, um, I told you on the phone we had a roommate that lived with us which  
147 is the landlord's cousin.  
148  
149 Q: Yeah and when was that? Uh, when did you first live at this residence?  
150  
151 A: I couldn't tell you.  
152  
153 Q: Okay.  
154  
155 A: Okay, I would say three months here - we've been here three months, I lived  
156 at the apartments off (Sunnyside) for six months.  
157  
158 Q: Now the apartments off of (Sunnyside)...  
159  
160 A: Uh, (Twincreeks) apartments.  
161  
162 Q: Okay, was he there with you?  
163  
164 A: No, it was just me and my girlfriend 'cause we had a problem...  
165  
166 Q: Do you know where he was living at the time?  
167  
168 A: Um, he had a house, he - he worked at - he works at some gyro shop down on  
169 - in the (Hawthorne) district area called (Big Bertha)'s or something.  
170  
171 Q: Okay.  
172  
173 A: And he lived with, uh, I guess a - he - the previous owner of the  
174 establishment, I don't know, he had said that the owner had just sold it to  
175 somebody else.  
176  
177 Q: Okay.  
178

179 A: Recently, I don't know.  
180  
181 Q: Did you ever remember him, uh, living in any of those apartments just - just  
182 kinda north of the Town Center.  
183  
184 A: Oh yeah, he did have an apartment there.  
185  
186 Q: When was that? Was it before he lived here for the second time?  
187  
188 A: Yeah, yeah it was before he lived here. It was before we moved in here the  
189 second time. Yes, and he then became our roommate.  
190  
191 Q: Okay so - so prior to you guys living here he...  
192  
193 A: I think it was right after he moved out of her parents' house is when he moved  
194 into those apartments out there.  
195  
196 Q: Okay. And then you guys moved - all - you, your girlfriend Jaime and then  
197 Jake Roberts moved in here?  
198  
199 A: Yeah, we - well - well the thing is...  
200  
201 Q: In September.  
202  
203 A: We moved here in September and we weren't gonna be able to cut the whole  
204 \$1200 rent so we looked for another roommate and - I didn't want a roommate  
205 after our last experience with a roommate at this house.  
206  
207 Q: Uh-huh.  
208  
209 A: But, you know, he's kinda like family to them so and he's a good kid so I said,  
210 "Yeah, he can go ahead and move in."  
211  
212 Q: So you really - and you call him Jake, right?  
213  
214 A: Yeah.  
215  
216 Q: You really know Jake through your girlfriend's fam- Jaime's family, right?  
217  
218 A: Yeah.  
219  
220 Q: Okay.  
221  
222 A: I - I didn't know him when I was younger or anything like that, no.  
223



224 Q: Okay you just met him.  
225  
226 A: Yeah.  
227  
228 Q: (Unintelligible). And then you guys became friends?  
229  
230 A: Yeah, he's a good kid.  
231  
232 Q: Okay. And then so the dynamic of this house - obviously we have the  
233 common area up here. He uses this kitchen and living room and stuff like  
234 that?  
235  
236 A: No this is our living room. He had his own TV and everything, his own cable  
237 box downstairs in his bedroom. We shared the kitchen and the bathroom.  
238  
239 Q: So is it safe to say other than the kitchen and the bathroom, which are on this  
240 main floor, he's pretty much got his own setup downstairs.  
241  
242 A: Yeah he did before he just started selling everything.  
243  
244 Q: Okay.  
245  
246 A: He sold everything and his - he was gonna move to Hawaii.  
247  
248 Q: And then when did...  
249  
250 A: This last two weeks I'd say - week and a half, maybe.  
251  
252 Q: So in the last two weeks he - he kinda came up with this idea of moving to  
253 Hawaii.  
254  
255 A: Yeah.  
256  
257 Q: Did he give any explanation on why he was...  
258  
259 A: He - he had - he had an inheritance that he had got and he'd put it into a CD  
260 loan. His CD loan was coming up in about two weeks - this was about a week  
261 and a half ago.  
262  
263 Q: Mm-hm.  
264  
265 A: He said his CD loan was coming up in about two weeks, he thinks he gonna  
266 move to Hawaii so he's just giving us a heads up.  
267  
268 Q: Does he have family in Hawaii or anything like that?

269  
270 A: No he just wanted to - he had I guess a significant amount of inheritance  
271 money...  
272  
273 Q: Do we know what - how much money he had?  
274  
275 A: I don't know how much.  
276  
277 Q: Okay.  
278  
279 A: And he just said he's young he wanted to go, you know, live off the - his  
280 inheritance for a little while, thinkin' maybe cutting down palm trees out  
281 there, he said.  
282  
283 Q: Where is his family?  
284  
285 A: I don't know. I have no idea of his family. I know that...  
286  
287 Q: Would Jaime know?  
288  
289 A: Jaime would know, yeah.  
290  
291 Q: Okay. Um, so again just to - just to - just to confirm, he was allowed - or he  
292 used the - you guys shared the kitchen and the bathroom up here.  
293  
294 A: Mm-hm.  
295  
296 Q: But his living area and space...  
297  
298 A: Was downstairs.  
299  
300 Q: It's downstairs. Is it locked? Um, I mean does he have his own entrance key?  
301  
302 A: He - he has an entrance he can go through. The - there's like - it's almost like  
303 a storm entrance. He never used it -- he has his own key to the front door.  
304  
305 Q: Okay, but he can access his - his living quarters.  
306  
307 A: Right through this way, right here where you see the light coming up from  
308 downstairs.  
309  
310 Q: Okay.  
311  
312 A: Just right down the - the stairs.  
313

314 Q: Okay. Um, and then so about two weeks ago he starts talking about moving  
315 to Hawaii because he's got inheritance that's maturing.  
316  
317 A: Mm-hm.  
318  
319 Q: And, um, you know, that's just something he wanted to do.  
320  
321 A: Yeah.  
322  
323 Q: Um, you talk about him acting weird. When did that start?  
324  
325 A: I'd say it started right before we left to Vegas. We left to Vegas on Thursday  
326 - last Thursday.  
327  
328 Q: Okay, so this is, like, something that's pretty recent?  
329  
330 A: Mm-hm. And, um, he was supposedly - 'cause when he told he was gonna  
331 leave to Vegas - or leave to Hawaii, we'd already told him, you know, we're  
332 going on a Vegas trip, you know, me, my girlfriend, her brother and her  
333 parents.  
334  
335 Q: And this is this previous Thursday.  
336  
337 A: This is just previous Thursday, we just got back Sunday.  
338  
339 Q: Okay.  
340  
341 A: And, uh, so we were, like, okay, you know, it's cool and, you know, if you're  
342 gonna leave for Hawaii, you know, whatever that's fine. But he had told us,  
343 you know, hey, I'm gonna sell all my stuff. So we figured, you know, a  
344 month or something. You know, he's selling all his stuff on Craigslist, we  
345 figured a month before he would move out.  
346  
347 Q: And what kind of stuff is he selling?  
348  
349 A: He sold his - he had a TV about similar size as this. He had his couches.  
350  
351 Q1: Did he sell that or...  
352  
353 A: Yeah. His couches, he had a TV stand, um, that was about it. I mean he had,  
354 like - he has a table downstairs, some end tables downstairs. He has a bed.  
355  
356 Q1: All in the last few days he sold all that stuff?  
357

358 A: He sold, uh, the couch before we left. I think it was, like, the first day he put  
359 it on Craigslist, he sold the couch the next day, um, he sold his Xbox I'm not  
360 sure when, and his TV I noticed - that's what made me kinda go down there  
361 was I noticed that all of his - his TV and everything was gone since we've  
362 been back. I hadn't been down there since we came back from Vegas. So  
363 then when I went down there I was, like, "Whoa," you know, and I kinda got  
364 nosey and walked over there just to see.  
365  
366 Q1: Mm-hm.  
367  
368 A: And, you know, all his stuff was just kinda pushed over to the side all nice and  
369 - and neat and tidy...  
370  
371 Q: And - and so that's when you found in the, uh, garbage...  
372  
373 A: Garbage. It's next to the end table. It's just sitting - it's like a bag and it's  
374 just kinda just pulled out - out of the bag, you know, there's like boxes of  
375 ammo.  
376  
377 Q: Empty boxes?  
378  
379 A: Yes, empty boxes of ammo.  
380  
381 Q1: And you found that when?  
382  
383 A: Just I'd say 12:00, 2 o'clock today maybe.  
384  
385 Q1: Yeah so you hadn't seen any of that stuff before?  
386  
387 A: No.  
388  
389 Q1: And no guns or ammo or anything?  
390  
391 A: No.  
392  
393 Q1: On him or...  
394  
395 Q: So - go ahead Lisa, I'm sorry.  
396  
397 Q1: Did he ever talk about guns or having guns or shooting guns?  
398  
399 A: No, I mean I heard that he used to have a gun, like a 45 or something a long  
400 time ago. But, um, you know, I'm a felon so when he moved in here I told  
401 him, you know, I can't have fire arms and he said he didn't have it anymore  
402 so.

403  
404 Q1: Okay.  
405  
406 Q: So other than this dream of going to Hawaii and selling all his stuff on  
407 Craigslist in very short order, um, you know, to kind of expedite that -  
408 anything else that you would consider weird about him? I mean is that what  
409 you're basing it on?  
410  
411 A: Just - just - no - just like when - when we woke up this morning, you know,  
412 normally, like I said before normally he - he's here, his car's out front when -  
413 when we wake up.  
414  
415 Q1: Mm.  
416  
417 Q: Yep.  
418  
419 A: We woke up this morning he wasn't and my girlfriend's aunt and uncle had  
420 stayed here...  
421  
422 Q: Right.  
423  
424 A: ...aunt and her husband had stayed here in my two children's room last night  
425 and so we woke up, I don't know, about maybe 8:30, 9:30 this morning. They  
426 were still here so we thought we'd wake up real quick to tell them bye and  
427 everything and, you know, I noticed, I looked outside his car wasn't there.  
428  
429 Q: And that's not typical.  
430  
431 A: And that's not typical. And so then...  
432  
433 Q: And then you say something about he - he works graveyard.  
434  
435 A: Yeah, he - he, well he works, um, 7:30 to 2:00 in the morning.  
436  
437 Q: Where at?  
438  
439 A: Um, at (Big Bertha)'s it like a gyro shop.  
440  
441 Q1: The gyro place.  
442  
443 Q: Yeah same - same place.  
444  
445 A: Yeah down in the (Hawthorne) district area.  
446  
447 Q: Okay.

448  
449 Q1: 7:30 to 2:00 is that what you said.  
450  
451 A: Yeah.  
452  
453 Q1: Okay.  
454  
455 A: 7:30 to like 2:00 am.  
456  
457 Q: And then I'm sorry what time did you wake up this morning.  
458  
459 A: I'd say maybe it was 8:30, 9:30, something like that.  
460  
461 Q: And the car wasn't here?  
462  
463 A: The car wasn't here.  
464  
465 Q: Okay.  
466  
467 A: So then when we were going outside to maybe 10 o'clock or something - her  
468 aunt just got out of the shower, just got dressed, we were helping her aunt and  
469 her husband take out the stuff to - the luggage to the car, he pulled up, came  
470 inside, grabbed maybe, I don't know, it's just like a garbage bag, you know,  
471 something - it didn't look like anything, you know, unusual, out of the  
472 ordinary and...  
473  
474 Q: Can you tell what shape this garbage bag was?  
475  
476 A: It was kind of - I mean honestly it looked like a bunch of clothes and he was  
477 holding a pair of work boots in his hand.  
478  
479 Q: Did he say...  
480  
481 Q1: From the car into the house.  
482  
483 A: From the house out to his car.  
484  
485 Q1: Oh, okay.  
486  
487 Q: Did he say anything?  
488  
489 A: No he didn't say anything. I just like, "Hey, what's going on man?" And he's  
490 like, "Hey, what's up?" you know, and not really making any eye contact and  
491 he left and he came back a little bit later and...  
492

493 Q: You remember what time that was about?  
494  
495 A: I can't recall what time it was. Um...  
496  
497 Q: Afternoon?  
498  
499 A: Yeah it was afternoon.  
500  
501 Q: Okay.  
502  
503 A: And, uh, he came back and he had - I don't know he - he came inside, went  
504 back out to his car and pulled away and I went into the bathroom and, uh, you  
505 know, I came back out and, uh, I don't know if Jaime said it then or maybe  
506 later - she had said it to me or something that that he came back into the house  
507 and took off and she asked him what he was doing and then he said, uh,  
508 "Going to help a friend." And she said "Do what?" And he said, "Oh, I'll tell  
509 you when I come back." You know and I don't know I did - didn't really seem  
510 - I don't think it seemed to her like it was anything special until, you know, all  
511 this stuff started happening.  
512  
513 Q: Do you know him to have any kind of, like, mental, uh, issues? I mean has he  
514 been depressed, um, you know...  
515  
516 A: You know, I don't know he seems like an uppity person. He's always  
517 smiling, you know, "Hey, how you guys doing?" you know, coming out.  
518  
519 Q: I mean he seem generally happy, uh, about this whole moving to Hawaii?  
520  
521 A: Yeah he was excited.  
522  
523 Q: Okay.  
524  
525 A: Really excited.  
526  
527 Q: In your opinion does he have a problem with alcohol or drugs?  
528  
529 A: Not that I know of.  
530  
531 Q: You don't know. You don't know him to smoke marijuana...  
532  
533 A: He might smoke marijuana, I mean, you know.  
534  
535 Q: Okay, you - does - so he does use marijuana?  
536  
537 A: He...

538  
539 Q: Recreational  
540  
541 A: Yeah, I'm sure he does.  
542  
543 Q: Um.  
544  
545 A: I know he has - there's a pipe downstairs.  
546  
547 Q: Okay, does he drink?  
548  
549 A: Um, yeah, I hear him drinking, yeah.  
550  
551 Q: Has it been a problem?  
552  
553 A: No, not that I know of.  
554  
555 Q: Do you know of him using any other illicit drugs or even prescription drugs or  
556 anything like that?  
557  
558 A: When we were just going down there looking through the bag, uh, I think I  
559 found a bag that may've contained meth or some kind of powder substance.  
560  
561 Q: Okay.  
562  
563 A: It looks like a little - I mean I used to do meth a long time ago.  
564  
565 Q: Okay, so in your experience...  
566  
567 A: I think I smelled it and it smelled like meth.  
568  
569 Q: Okay.  
570  
571 A: I've been clean for, like, over six and a half years so I was, like, I know what  
572 it smells like and...  
573  
574 Q: Sure. So you believe there's meth down there. And is that in the s- where is  
575 that in...  
576  
577 A: It's in the bag with all the receipts in the boxes with the mags and stuff.  
578  
579 Q: Okay, and - and then just try and timeline that for me, when did you find,  
580 those, uh, empty, uh, ammo boxes.  
581  
582 A: See that's the thing, I seen them this morning about - I don't know.



583  
584 Q: And then it was a short time after that that you Googled it 'cause you didn't  
585 know what it was.  
586  
587 A: No, I Googled it as soon as I came upstairs so..  
588  
589 Q: Okay, so you find - you go and...  
590  
591 A: Let's see, maybe my phone will say.  
592  
593 Q: Yeah, so let me just kinda summarize this. So this morning you find he - it,  
594 you see he's not here...  
595  
596 A: Mm-hm.  
597  
598 Q: You're kinda...  
599  
600 A: No, I seen - I seen it after - okay so after her parent - or her aunt and Uncle  
601 (Louie) left, you know, I seen it some time after that, when we started doing  
602 laundry.  
603  
604 Q: Okay.  
605  
606 A: Because, I mean, we had a bunch of laundry b- built up from our Vegas trip,  
607 we hadn't done anything yet with it.  
608  
609 Q: Is the laundry downstairs?  
610  
611 A: Yes it's downstairs.  
612  
613 Q: Okay. Is that the common area you guys share downstairs?  
614  
615 A: Yes, we share that.  
616  
617 Q: Do you guys share any other common areas downstairs? So your sole purpose  
618 to go downstairs is to use...  
619  
620 A: Yeah, the laundry. 'Cause, like, if you walk down the stairs the laundry's to  
621 the right and then his whole area's, like, basically this whole underneath the  
622 house.  
623  
624 Q: So kinda in summary, he's got this weird behavior of selling all his stuff.  
625  
626 A: Yeah.  
627

628 Q: And then this morning after your company leaves you go down there and just  
629 kinda, you know, inspect some of the bags that he has.  
630

631 A: Mm-hm.  
632

633 Q: Find this ammo - these empty ammo boxes that you Google and find out that  
634 they're like (unintelligible).  
635

636 A: AR 223 American Eagle. Apparently I looked it up - well it just said I looked  
637 it up at 9:41 'cause I just clicked on it to see what time I looked it up before.  
638

639 Q: Okay, 9:41 am you looked it up.  
640

641 A: No, no it says 9:41 pm 'cause I just accidentally hit it.  
642

643 Q: Oh, okay.  
644

645 A: But it was AR223 American Eagle.  
646

647 Q: Is that what - is that verbatim what it was...  
648

649 A: What it is downstairs, yes.  
650

651 Q: It's American Eagle...  
652

653 A: 223.  
654

655 Q: AR 223 ammo.  
656

657 A: Yes.  
658

659 Q: How many boxes?  
660

661 A: I'd say there's, like, at least three.  
662

663 Q: At least three?  
664

665 Q1: And they're empty?  
666

667 A: They're empty.  
668

669 Q: And is that when you found the receipts?  
670

671 A: I didn't look through the receipts until after I made the phone call to you guys  
672 and I'm sitting here thinking in my head...

673  
674 Q: Okay, that's okay.  
675  
676 A: Please don't be him, please don't be him. And so I went down there to snoop  
677 a little bit to see if maybe it was him, hoping it wasn't and the more I found  
678 the more (unintelligible).  
679  
680 Q: So that first time you went down there to inspect his stuff. What - what...  
681  
682 A: I just seen the cases.  
683  
684 Q: Just the ammo boxes?  
685  
686 A: Yeah.  
687  
688 Q: Googled it found that it was an American Eagle brand AR?  
689  
690 A: Well no it says American Eagle on it. I found out that it's for AR's and  
691 M16's.  
692  
693 Q: What did they look like? What do the ammo boxes look like?  
694  
695 A: There's, like, these long clear plastic things.  
696  
697 Q: Okay.  
698  
699 A: And then their black and silver boxes.  
700  
701 Q: Black and silver boxes. Okay, you said there's about three of them.  
702  
703 A: Roughly more maybe.  
704  
705 Q: And anything else you found during that first inspection?  
706  
707 A: No.  
708  
709 Q: Okay and then, um, so then you have some contact with him when he comes  
710 home? He's carrying a - a garbage bag?  
711  
712 A: He - no he just goes downstairs and grabs the garbage bag...  
713  
714 Q: Oh.  
715  
716 A: ...comes inside, puts it in his car and...  
717

718 Q: But you can't tell what's in the garbage bag?  
719  
720 A: No, it just - I mean it had - torn - it looked torn - it looked like an old - maybe  
721 it's just clothes or something he was giving to Goodwill, I don't know.  
722  
723 Q: Okay. And you guys...  
724  
725 A: I noticed he had work boots.  
726  
727 Q: Did you guys talk at all when he was home that time?  
728  
729 A: Not really, just kinda "Hey, how's it going?" you know, in passing, you know,  
730 nothing in depth, nothing like "Hey, what are you doing?"  
731  
732 Q: Nothing seemed, uh, suspicious or weird?  
733  
734 A: No, not - the only thing seemed suspicious or - the only that seemed weird, I  
735 wouldn't say suspicious was that he was coming home at 9:30 in the morning.  
736  
737 Q: Okay.  
738  
739 A: When usually he's here when we get up.  
740  
741 Q1: And did he work last night?  
742  
743 A: He left last night like he went to work.  
744  
745 Q1: Mm. Mm-hm.  
746  
747 Q: Okay.  
748  
749 Q1: Do you know his schedule at work?  
750  
751 A: Usually 7:30 to 2:00.  
752  
753 Q1: Do you know what days he works?  
754  
755 A: I don't. He - it varies he says.  
756  
757 Q1: Okay.  
758  
759 Q: And then prior to leaving again - or he left after he got the, uh, garbage bag?  
760  
761 A: Yeah. And then I...  
762

763 Q: And then he came back a little bit later, right?  
764  
765 A: Yeah, I don't know maybe two ish, I don't know maybe Jaime could give you  
766 a better idea what time it was, I - honestly I wasn't paying attention, like, it  
767 wasn't...  
768  
769 Q: Okay and when he comes back again, what happens?  
770  
771 A: He just came, goes downstairs, comes back up, walked out to his car. I don't  
772 know if he was holding anything in his hand, I don't - I don't remember, you  
773 know, um...  
774  
775 Q: Did you talk to him at all?  
776  
777 A: Uh-huh.  
778  
779 Q: But Jaime did.  
780  
781 A: It - it was kinda just that, you know, it was maybe a "Hi, how you doing?" in  
782 passing. "Hey, see you later."  
783  
784 Q1: You remember what he was wearing?  
785  
786 A: Black. Black pants, black, uh, kinda thermal shirt.  
787  
788 Q: Black or dark colored.  
789  
790 A: It was black.  
791  
792 Q: What about shoes?  
793  
794 A: You know, I don't know - I mean it could've been his black ones with the  
795 neon green, I don't know. Those are the ones he's been wearing lately.  
796  
797 Q1: Okay.  
798  
799 Q: But uncertain?  
800  
801 A: Uncertain. I know that when he - this morning I did notice - I don't know if  
802 this means anything or anything, in his back seat when he opened the door to  
803 put the bag in there this morning...

During the early hours of the investigation on 12/11/12 Mr Lonbardo called in saying that he knew the name of the shooting suspect. This was hours before investigators had identified the suspect or released his name or photo to the public. Detectives Erichsen and Pearson left the command post and met with Mr Lonbardo in a local parking lot to follow up on this lead.


When they returned, the detectives explained that Mr Lonbardo identified the suspect as a 'street kid' who he only knew as "Chris". Chris also went by the nickname 'shooter'. He described him as a white male, between 20 and 24 years old, about six feet tall, 180 pounds, with light brown hair. Mr Lonbardo told of how he heard a phone message from 'Chris' saying he was going to "live up to his name" and that if Lonbardo wanted to stop him to meet him at the Clackamas Town Center mall Macy's store at 3:00pm. This information also resulted in written tip that was completed by Detective Pearson but before the tips were assigned individual tracking numbers.



By the late morning of 12/12/12 the suspect, Jacob Roberts, had been positively identified and a photo had been publicized by the news media. The information that Mr Lonbardo provided hours after the incident were so detailed regarding the time and location of the incident I wanted to find out if Mr Lonbardo recognized Suspect Roberts.

At approximately 1:50pm I called Mr Lonbardo on his cell phone. Mr Lonbardo said that he had not yet any of the photos in the news of the suspect. I send him a photo of Suspect Roberts and asked him if he recognized that person. He replied that the picture is of the person who he knows as "Chris", although he looks a better than he did when he saw him last, which was over a year ago.

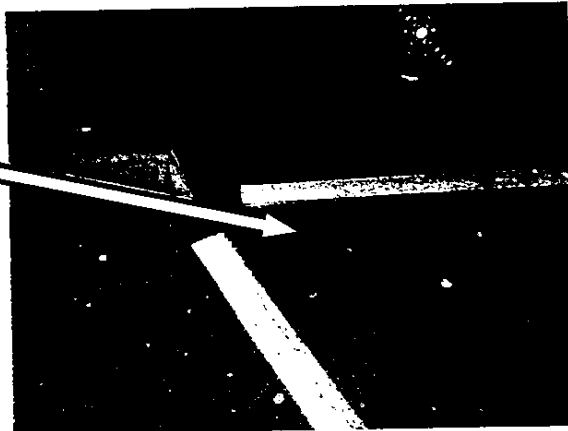

After I was finished with my duties inside the mall searching for the suspect and injured citizens I returned to my car that was parked outside of upper level Macy's Clothing store. When I returned to the parking lot I saw that Deputy Leikem was still standing guard over the loaded rifle magazine that was found in the parking lot. I secured my tactical gear in my car, obtained some evidence collection equipment, and went over to his location.

At approximately 4:49pm I started taking photos of the area surrounding the rifle magazine and then closer photos of the actual item.

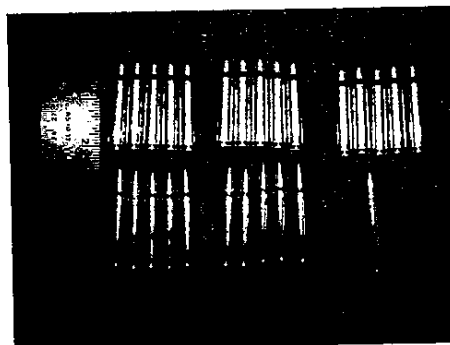
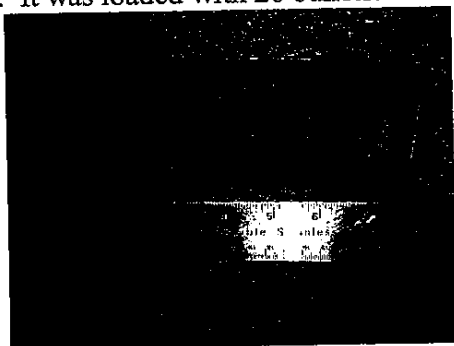
While wearing protective gloves I picked up the magazine from the ground and placed it in a paper bag as an item of evidence. I sealed the bag by folding the top over several times. I quickly drew a crude sketch of the layout of the curbing and parking spaces in the area. I took photos of the license plates of the four or five vehicles that were parked closest to the rifle magazine. I secured the evidence item in the trunk of my car for the next eight or nine hours until I returned to the office.


At the office I secured the item in a locked evidence locker, to which I retained the only key. The item remained in the locker until I removed it on the afternoon of 01/04/13 for the purpose of taking additional photos, inventorying the bullets, and documenting the item for submission to the CCSO Evidence & Property Room.

I donned protective gloves and examined the magazine. The magazine was a polymer "P-Mag" for .223 caliber ammunition from the company MAGPULL. It was capable of holding 30 bullets. It was loaded with 26 bullets.



I completed a PIC form for the magazine and the bullets and sealed both items in separate bags. I later submitted the item to the CCSO Evidence & Property Room.

Using my crude sketch I created the attached drawing of the curbing and parking spaces that were surrounding the evidence item. I also referenced my photos and include the license plates of the vehicles that were parked nearby.

He dropped it on the ground by the white paint that separates the driving lanes. Bianca said about a minute elapsed from when he ran into Macy's before people started running out.

I asked Bianca if she knew the guy. She answered no but he lived in her old neighborhood but she never met him. I asked why she first noticed him. She said she thought he was in a Nerf gun fight like her brothers play. She thought it was a joke until people were running out and crying.

I asked Bianca if there was anything else she thought we should know. She said no and her biggest thing was to protect the magazine for fingerprints. She didn't want to leave until the police had it. She said they then left because she was obviously scared.





On 12-28-12 at 8:39 am, I called Rodd Meier in regards to Tip #268 and left a message on his voicemail requesting he call back if he had information to provide. We exchanged multiple phone messages back and forth until I called him on 01-02-12 at 2:43 pm when we were able to talk.

I asked Rodd if he had witnessed the shooter and he told me he didn't. He explained he was laying on the floor and looking up. He saw a young man in his 20's wearing black pants, a black coat and a black hat running towards JC Penney's. At the time, he thought he might be the shooter but he didn't see a gun. Since then, he has talked with a friend of his who is a Sandy Police Officer who told him by that time, the shooter had already killed himself.

I asked Rodd to explain why he was laying on the floor. He said he had gone to Barnes & Noble to get his wife a CD. He then went to Starbucks and walked past Santa towards Macy's on the lower level. He was going to Teavanna but was sitting in a leather chair by the fish ponds first. That's when he heard the suspect open fire.

Rodd said he thought he heard 12 to 15 shots and said there were no more than 15 to 20 shots. As soon as he heard the shots, he hit the floor between a kiosk and the leather chair. After a few minutes, he saw the described person running past him fast on the lower level.

Rodd said after a few minutes again he peeked around the chair. He thought the coast was clear and he remembers it was eerily quiet. He ran through Teavanna to a storage room. There were about 20 women hiding there who he scared when he entered. He had to assure them he was hiding too and not the suspect. Rodd said he remembers the women crying and he had to tell them to shut up and be quiet as to not give away their location. Rodd said he then barricaded the door with boxes.


Rodd said he stayed there until the coast was clear. I asked him how he knew the coast was clear and he said they were notified by an employee. He wasn't sure if this employee was the manager or not. They were then led through a corridor between Teavanna and Macy's to the outside. 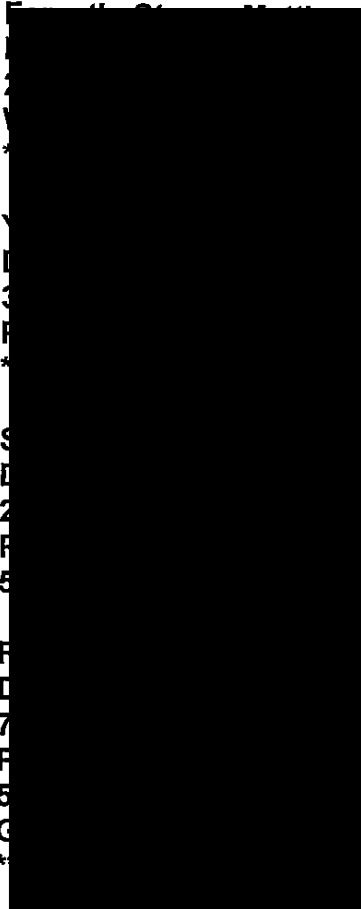

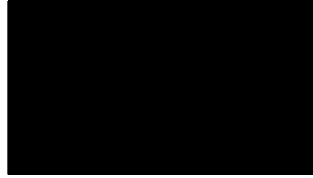

On 01-02-13 at 9:03 am, I called Morgan Lyon in regards to Tip #233 and left a message requesting her to call back if she had information to provide for this case. At 1:18 pm Morgan returned my call and we were able to talk.

Morgan told me she was the first employee who saw the suspect enter the mall. She works at Macy's and saw him come in the south entrance into her store. She was on the aisle folding clothes and he ran less than five feet away from her. Morgan clarified it was the west aisle he ran down towards the entrance into the mall from Macy's.

I asked Morgan what drew her attention to him. She first noticed someone running which isn't usual unless it's a kid. She saw that he had a mask and a gun. Morgan described the mask like a theatre mask, similar to the Phantom of the Opera style but it covered his whole face. She said it wasn't a hockey style mask.

Morgan said the suspect was by himself and she didn't hear him say anything when he was running through the store. She said she and another coworker across the aisle from her looked at each other and questioned what they saw. They ran to a phone at the nearest register and asked the lady there if she saw that too. Before she could dial, she heard the shots go off.

I asked Morgan what happened next. She said everyone ducked to the ground, screamed and she ran out of the mall. She went out the closest door which was the south entrance and she ran to 82<sup>nd</sup> Ave. I asked if she noticed anything when she was outside and gave the example of a getaway car or anything suspicious. She said she didn't notice anything. She did see cars coming into the lot and some were asking what was going on.

Morgan said she didn't recognize the suspect once she saw him on the news. She has friends that knew him.

Morgan confirmed she only heard the shooting and didn't see it happening. She said the shots were so loud but she doesn't know if the suspect was in the store or not when he started shooting.

Morgan said the suspect was wearing black clothes, black jeans, white shoes and what she thought was a bullet proof vest. She later learned it was a vest for holding ammunition. She said the first thought through her head was the gun was fake and this was a joke.

Finally, Morgan said there were five shots total that she heard. She described it as boom boom, then three more shots. I received her contact information and thanked her for calling back before we ended the call.





## Narrative:

On 12-11-2012 shortly before 1600 hours I was contacted by telephone by Kathy Egli with the Oregon State Police Forensics Lab. Ms. Egli advised me they were in lock down due to an active shooter at Clackamas Town Center. I pulled the CAD call and after reading it I made several phone calls to Criminalist Martin, Criminalist Shelley, and Criminalist Bailey, as well as attempting to contact Sgt. Anderson and Sgt. Swanson. I was unable to reach anyone and I left messages for all of them advising I was heading to Clackamas Town Center.

At about 1605 hours, I left my office in Oregon City and drove to the scene in Clackamas. While driving, I received calls from several outside agencies including OSP and Gresham Police Department's Criminalist Melissa Arne offering assistance.

After arriving at Clackamas Town Center a short time later, I spoke with MCT Coordinator/DA Investigator, Brian Schmautz. Investigator Schmautz was coordinating additional resources and advised Portland Police Criminalists, OSP Crime Scene personnel, and Don Hemstreet with Canby, were available to assist us. I advised him to go ahead and send them over to our command post where I would meet them. I contacted Melissa Arne and accepted her offer to also assist. I spoke several times with Investigator Schmautz as well as Lt. Wendi Babst coordinating CSI personnel to the command post near the east side of the mall.

After the arrival of Criminalist Shelley, Criminalist Martin, OSP, PPB, Canby, Gresham Police, and the Medical Examiner's team to the command post, we began the discussion of processing the scene. As we were discussing the scene, Ken Jones with PPB offered to utilize their Leica scan station inside the scene. CRAFT personnel were brought in to the discussion and it was agreed we would use the Leica scan station.

Lt. Babst advised she wanted us to go in and first begin by videotaping the scene, preferably with three separate video cameras. I passed this information on to the other CSI personnel on scene and it was agreed that we would go in to the scene as three teams, which would include a detective with each team (Detective Nunn, Detective Lee, Detective Cate). OSP agreed to take the shooter and the nearby scene on the lower level, while our two teams, along with PPB's scanning team (which also included Criminalist Arne from Gresham), took the upper level and two victims. The DME, Eric Tonsfeldt would handle each body inside as we went. It was not completely clear at this time how large the scene possibly was and we agreed to again discuss the scene after we got inside and saw what we had and what we would need to do.

We signed in and entered the mall through the food court doors at about 1834 hours. Criminalist Martin, Criminalist Shelley and Chrystal Bell with OSP were all videotaping as we entered. After entering the mall, I noticed a bullet strike in a large upright advertisement triangle. Nearby, to the west of the triangle was



another bullet strike to a tiled pillar. Around this pillar was seating and a ledge for people to eat at.

Throughout the food court there were personal items such as clothes, cellular phones, strollers, shopping bags and other belongings just left in place as if people had left very quickly.

Continuing in to the mall, nearing the escalator, there was broken glass on the east side of the escalator where it appeared a bullet had struck, shattering the glass. The bullet appeared to have come from the south side (Macy's side), striking a wood railing on the north side and continuing through two nettings on children's carts before striking the escalator glass. Near the wood railing, there was a chair with a coat in it, and a hat and coffee cup on a nearby table as if someone had been sitting there.

Near the escalator we met with Detective Bray. He briefed several of us on parts of the scene. At about 1845 hours, the three teams split up. Criminalist Martin continued to the west to a female victim later identified as Cindy Yuille. OSP continued downstairs and to the east toward the shooter's location near JCPenney. Criminalist Shelley and I continued to the south toward Macy's where there was a male victim later identified as Steven Forsyth, as well as multiple spent cartridge casings and pieces of bone fragments which had been tented with small pieces of paper.

Traveling from west to east in front of the upper level Macy's main mall doors, there were multiple spent cartridge casings near an ATM and closer to Macy's main doors, east of that was Mr. Forsyth's body and additional spent cartridge casings, bone fragments, a magazine with live rounds and one live round on the floor just east of the magazine.

I continued east through the mall looking for additional items of evidence. In front of the Macy's home store on the floor there was a black gun magazine with multiple live rounds in it. The magazine had a yellow tented janitor sign over it. To the east of the magazine were doors for corridor 13. Continuing east toward JCPenney there were additional doors for corridor 13 just outside of JCPenney's upper level mall doors.

On the lower level in front of JCPenney were another set of corridor doors where law enforcement officers were stationed near the shooter's body. Southwest of the JCPenney lower level doors there were several tented pieces of paper covering blood drops. Detective Cate advised he would like to have swabs of these and I passed that information on to OSP who was processing this area.

At about 1920 hours, Detective Cate, Evidence Technician Hemstreet, Criminalist Shelley and I entered the upstairs corridor 13 doors and followed the corridor around to stairs leading downstairs. The stairs split in to two sets of open stairs but



ended near the same location at the bottom. At the bottom we went toward the east toward the shooter's location. As we were walking through the corridor, we were approached by a search team member who advised there was a live round around the corridor to the west. We were told it had a business card tented over it. I advised OSP of this round as they were processing this area. After arriving at the shooters location we then went back and walked down the corridor to the west and located the live round near service corridor door 2.

As we came out of the door at about 1947 hours, we met up with Detective Krummenacker. Detective Krummenacker advised someone had reported possibly seeing blood on a shoe in the back of corridor 4 near Just Sports (lower level). We walked through corridor 4 and did not find any blood, but did see some old red paint spots on the floor. We exited the corridors and I walked to the Best Buy Mobile Store to talk with other investigators about our scene. It appeared that other than the shooter's area, most of our scene was near the two victims and the food court area.

When I returned to the upstairs area, I met with PPB personnel, Criminalist Arne with Gresham, Criminalist Martin and other investigators and we discussed areas of possible evidence. It was agreed that we would utilize the Leica station starting with the west side of the scene and continuing to the east and then around to the food court. After each victim was scanned in the scene, then DME Tonsfeldt would remove the bodies and then we could collect the evidence.

At about 2015 hours, I began taking digital photographs of the scene, starting from west to east. While I photographed, Criminalist Martin, Criminalist Shelley, and Technician Hemstreet placed numbered placards over items of evidence, marked accessible bullet strikes with letters, and placed trajectory rods where they could. Items and bullet strikes were continually labeled as they were located, starting with west to east.

There were several possible bullet strikes which were not labeled with letters but photographed and should be noted as possible strikes. There were several holes through a hanging mini cooper sign in the middle of an open area near the female victim. There appeared to be a possible bullet strike on the wall above and to the east of the lower level H&M store, which is below and to the west of the mini cooper sign and below and to the west of the female victim. In the food court, there was a defect on the wall near the Carl's Jr. sign. I searched around in these areas for possible bullet fragments and did not locate any.

The numbered placards were placed beginning from west to east, starting near the female victim, Cindy Yuille. All placarded items were later collected and documented on a Property in Custody Report. Items 1 to 5 were located near Cindy Yuille's body. See Criminalist Martin's report for additional details.



Items 6 to 9 were four spent LC12 cartridge casings located in close proximity to one another on the floor. They were located just northwest of Macy's upper level main mall doors near an ATM machine and railing.

Items 10 to 14 were to the east of items 6 to 9 and were also spent LC12 cartridge casings located on the floor. They were located just northeast of Macy's upper level main interior doors between the doors and the Coastoms kiosk.

Item 15 was a spent LC12 cartridge casing located on the floor to the east of item 14 and to the north of the Zales Jewelers main door, more centered in the middle of the walkway. Item 15 was to the east of Mr. Forsyth.

To the west of item 15 and east of the Coastoms kiosk was Steven Forsythe. He was lying on the floor to the northeast of Macy's upper level main entry doors and to the north of Zales Jewelers main door. He was lying on his stomach with his face toward the west and his hands under his body. His head was toward the north and his feet to the south. There was a lot of blood around his head and upper body and I could see a traumatic head injury. Mr. Forsyth was wearing a beige shirt, brown pants and white tennis shoes.

To the west of Mr. Forsyth and east of the Coastoms kiosk there was an open Verizon Samsung flip phone labeled as item 16.

Mr. Forsythe had been covered with a blue blanket type covering and this had been moved off of him and placed near the railing, west of the flip phone. The blanket was labeled as item 17.

On the glass wall railing north of Mr. Forsythe there was a small amount of blood spatter located. To the east of Mr. Forsythe near the railing there were bone fragments located near a cushioned bench and a pillar. There were also additional fragments located east of item 19. The fragments were later collected by DME Tonsfeldt.

Items 18 to 22 were spent LC12 cartridge casings lying on the floor. These were located to the east of Mr. Forsythe and to the north east of the front of the Zales Jewelers main store front. Item 18 was located north of item 15. Item 19 was located to the east of item 15. Item 20 was to the north east of items 18 and 19. Item 21 was about two feet north of item 20.

Item 22 was a spent LC12 cartridge casing located on the floor north of the Zales Jewelers main store front to the east of item 19.

To the east of item 22 there was an upright triangle reader board. At the bottom of this board on the floor was a black Colt magazine containing six live LC cartridges. To the east side of the reader board on the floor was item 25, which was a live LC cartridge which did not appear to have a primer hit on it. To the





north of the reader board was item 24 which was a spent LC cartridge casing located on the floor.

To the far east of this location in front of the upper level Macy's home store was item 26. Item 26 was a black plastic 30 round PMag magazine containing thirty-one live LC cartridges.

Item 27, 28, 29 and 30 were possible bullet fragments on the floor near the northwest food court restrooms. Items 27, 28, and 29 were found on the tile floor near a bullet strike (labeled as C) which had impacted a bathroom door. Item 30 was found just south of the bullet strike on the carpet near a table in the seating area.

At around 2200 hours, it was decided Criminalist Shelley and Technician Hemstreet could clear the scene. It was agreed Criminalist Martin and I would continue to work in to the night and they would attend the postmortem exams scheduled for the next day.

At about 2240 hours DME Tonsfeldt removed Cindy Yuille's body from the scene.

PPB was still scanning the area around Macy's so it was decided that DME Tonsfeldt could go ahead and remove the shooter's body while PPB finished the scan near Macy's. At about 2255 hours DME Tonsfeldt with the assistance of Criminalist Martin, removed Jacob Roberts body from the scene.

At about 2300 hours, I met with Leland Samuelson with the Oregon State Police Forensics Lab who was working the shooters scene. Mr. Samuelson said they had finished processing the shooters area and downstairs. Mr. Samuelson gave me the packaged items of evidence and assisted me in completing the PIC form based on his notes. See the PIC and Mr. Samuelson's report for additional.

At about 0105 hours Steven Forsythe's body was removed by DME Tonsfeldt.

At about 0215 hours, I assisted with a walk through of the scene for CCSO detectives. During that walk through detectives did not feel it was necessary to scan the area where the shooter was located and to finish the scan at the Macy's Home Store.

At about 0255 hours, Criminalist Martin and I finished collecting all of the items of evidentiary value and loaded them in my van.

Criminalist Martin and I continued to work with PPB while the Leica scan station was scanning the scene. It was agreed that I would clear the scene and transport the evidence to property control while Criminalist Martin stayed at the scene with PPB until they finished the scan.



At about 0410 hours, I cleared the Clackamas Town Center scene and transported the evidence I had collected to property control. I arrived at about 0427 hours and secured the evidence from the scene.

At about 1205 hours (12-12-12) I spoke with Sgt. Swanson by telephone. We discussed doing another walk through of the scene at Clackamas Town Center. We agreed to meet at 1300 hours at the food court entrance. I told him I would get a hold of Criminalist Shelley and have him meet us there as well.

I then called Criminalist Shelley who was just finishing up at the Medical Examiner's office. He said he would be leaving shortly and would meet us at Clackamas Town Center.

I arrived at Clackamas Town Center at about 1234 hours and met with Sgt. Swanson. We then met with Detective Juker and Criminalist Shelley. Other investigators were also on scene.

We entered the mall at about 1300 hours to begin searching for any additional evidence. Inside the food court we met up with Detectives Cate and Krummenacker. At about 1308 hours, Detective Krummenacker gave me an unfired FC cartridge which he said he had found on the south side of Macy's. It was already packaged and it was labeled as item 31.

We discussed where to start and agreed we would start at the Macy's south doors where Jacob Roberts had first entered. We searched along both walkway paths looking for any additional evidence. I searched standing as well as on my hands and knees. While we were searching, Criminalist Martin arrived on scene.

Near the main upper level Macy's mall doors just inside the doors to the east, there was a bullet strike through a clothes stand which appeared to be traveling from northwest to southeast. The strike was near the bottom of the stand. Criminalist Martin and Gresham Police Criminalist Arne had found this strike the night before. The team did a more thorough search at this time and Detective Juker was able to locate two small bullet fragments south of the strike. I photographed the stand, a possible strike point nearby and the bullet fragments. The fragments were collected and labeled as items 32 and 33.

Just outside of the Macy's store, to the east was Zales Jewelers store. Inside the store there were two bullet strikes located on the east wall near a wreath. The top strike was labeled as letter L and the bottom strike which went through the wood decorative strip was labeled as M. Both of these strikes continued through the wall into service corridor 14 and continued in to the next wall of the corridor and in to Tilly's clothing store through the Tilly's west wall. Trajectory rods were used and photographs were taken. Bullet fragments were located east of the Tilly's wall strike in the front display area of the store on the floor. The two fragments were




labeled as items 34 and 35. I photographed and collected the fragments at about 1358 hours.

We continued to search the upper and lower floors. Near the bottom of the escalator which led up to the food court, I found a small bullet fragment on the floor at about 1420 hours. It was labeled as item 36, photographed, and collected.

No additional items of evidence were located and we returned to the food court area where we briefed about the scene. At about 1505 hours I left the mall and loaded the items of evidence we had collected in to my van. I cleared the scene at about 1507 hours and transported the evidence to property control. I arrived at about 1527 hours and secured all of the evidence.

I later downloaded the digital images from my camera and made two DVD copies for evidence and a copy for the case agent.

## NARRATIVE:

Detective Burlew requested I collect one half hour segment of surveillance footage from each of the stores at the Clackamas Town Center. I created a request letter on Sheriff's letterhead asking for surveillance footage dated 12-11-12 from 1515 hours to 1545 hours. I obtained a team of three people and we visited every store in the mall handing out the letter. I was then contacted by several stores to either pick up footage or help with capturing the footage.

In the end 178 stores were contacted and surveillance was collected from 40 of those stores. The rest of the stores either had no surveillance system or their system was malfunctioning and was unable to download footage.

The stores with footage of the crime were (in order of shooters appearance):

- CTC – Suspect running through parking lot towards Macy's clothing store south entrance.
- Macy's – Suspect enters Macy's Clothing store south door.
- Best Buy – Bullet breaks glass in Best Buy Mobile/ Victim Yuille is shot.
- Zales – Victim Mr. Forsyth is shot/ Suspect walks east on south side of walkway.
- Tilly's – Suspect walks east on south side walkway.
- Charlotte Russe – Suspect runs east on south side walkway past store then turns around to west and crosses to Morgan Jewelers.






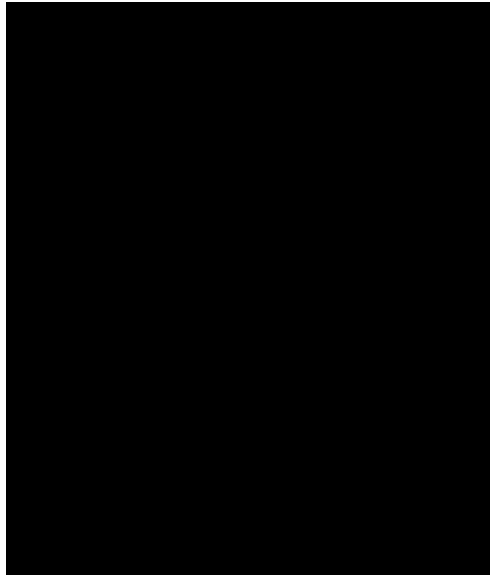

I searched for keywords that may be relevant to the situation and examined the resulting search hits. I also examined documents, both remaining and deleted.

One file that I noted was the "FB.url" file on the desktop. This was a shortcut that takes the user to the internet site:

I downloaded the content of this Facebook page for archival, evidentiary purposes.

I found Microsoft Works document autosave temporary files in the User Temp folder. The original documents had been deleted. I printed some that may be of some relevance.

I checked the internet history for relevant information. I found that on 11/29/12 at 02:21 am the user searched for, then explored the internet site: [www.nwarmory.com](http://www.nwarmory.com) apparently interested in handguns. I printed several pages that show the pages the user viewed. The user left the site after about 6 minutes.

There was an interest in Hawaii on 12-2-12 with visits to Hawaiian Airline, Alaska Airline and several Oahu based hotels. One particular visit at 04:28 am was a search for Starwood Hotels. The record is decoded below using Netanalysis:

Were there problems with drugs and or alcohol in the family? How did that affect you? for years in early childhood my mom would take me to these NA and AA meetings all the time. It was pretty much the way I grew up as a child, going every week to hear people talk about how they went through horrible things and how they wanted to turn themselves around. But when I was getting older she started smoking pot. And I knew that she was smoking it. I knew the smell, I knew that when the door was closed and I heard coughing that she was smoking pot. And I remember telling myself that I never wanted to do that in my lifetime. It was later when she found out that I knew that she was smoking pot. But she still never smoked in front of me. But I do remember when I was in junior high I came home one day and there was just this strong smell of pot coming from my house. And when I went in the house she was just standing there in the kitchen. I knew she was high but I didn't want to say anything. But she was making special brownies like it was nothing. And I went to ask if I could have a brownie to see what she would say, and she flat out told me that I couldn't have any because there was pot in them. It sometimes made me wonder how my life would have turned out if she didn't smoke pot. During high school is when drugs came into play with me. My friends were doing it, my mom was doing it. So why couldn't I do it right? I smoked two times in my life before my mom found out that I smoked pot. And when she did find out she turned to me and said, "hey Jake, lets go smoke a bowl." I immediately told her that I didn't smoke and she told me that it was fine and that she already knew. I was sixteen when I started smoking with my mom. She packed the bowl and told me to take the first hit. I thought that she was setting a trap for me but it wasn't. I took a hit and went to pass it and she told me not to. She said, "if your going to act like a stoner your going to smoke like a stoner. Your going to smoke that whole bowl to yourself." and to be honest with you I did I smoked the whole thing. Afterwards she tells me that I had to clean the bathroom for my punishment. But after that it was a daily thing. I would come home and smoke with my mom, go hang out with friends come home and smoke with my mom. Smoking weed in that house after she found out was like losing a penny, it doesn't really matter. She made all sorts of food with weed in it. I remember her saying that we were going to have potscettie for dinner one night. It was just that open in the house. And when I was seventeen I broke my foot and couldn't walk for six months my mom took away my pain meds and told me that she didn't want me getting hooked on pills and said that she would give me all the weed I wanted instead. Trading one drug for another? How does that work out. I remember her saying that she had shrooms and asked if I wanted to try some. She said that she would rather have me do them with her rather than doing it with other people. I felt like I could take them and she would be ok with that. She is allowing me to smoke, now shrooms. So there I sat, in the living room watching television high as a kite, and she was right next to me on the same boat as I was. But she never drank. She was clean for 21 going on 22 years before she had her first drink recently. But I drank, I drank at parties, I drank at friends house. It was a thing that I did.

I wouldn't say that I was a hardcore I want to drink every minute every second of my life drinker. I was more of a yeah drinking sounds fun I could drink but its not on my top things to do list kinda drinker. 

## NARRATIVE:

On the afternoon of 121112 I received information a shooting had occurred at the Clackamas Town Center. At approximately 1630 hours I arrived at the Clackamas Town Center and reported to the Command Post. I was assigned to conducted interviews with several witnesses who had been escorted out of the mall.

I made contact with Grant Zirkle in an office of the Trimet parking structure. Zirkle told me arrived at the Clackamas Town Center at approximately 1350 hours to pick up his sister. He said his sister was at the mall to pick up her paycheck from Subway. He said he parked his car in front of the Macy's store on the south side of the mall. Zirkle said when he got out of his car he noticed several people running from the mall saying there was a shooting. He told me he never saw the shooter or any shooting victims. Zirkle said he found his sister running out of the mall and then was escorted to this area to be interviewed. I ended my interview with Zirkle.

Next, I spoke with Jacob Rogers. Rogers told me he arrived at the mall at approximately 1230 hours to begin his shift at Champ's Sporting Goods. He said this store is across from the Macy's store. He said he was inside the store helping several customers when he heard five to seven shots. Rogers said a few seconds past then he heard four to six more shots. He said numerous customers ran from the front of the store to back of it. He said his store manager closed the gate at the front of the store and got the three employees and five customers to back employee section of the store. Rogers said they had a camera back there which allowed them to see the front of the store.

Rogers said he did not see any victims and did not see the shooter. He said during the shooting it was very quiet in the mall. He said he heard someone say they had seen a "gun clip" laying on the ground outside of the Macy's Home Store. He told me he remained in the Champ's store until he was escorted out by police officers. I ended my interview with Rogers.

Lastly, I spoke with Christopher Trudeau. He told me he is the manager at the Hobby Shop in the mall. He said he arrived at approximately 0900 hours today. He said at approximately 1520 to 1530 hours he left the shop to go get sandwich. Trudeau said he was by the large Christmas tree near the Macy's Home Store. He said he looked up and saw a male wearing a black hooded sweatshirt (pulled over his head), black shoes, black pants, white gloves and a Jason style hockey mask. He said the male was standing very upright and was randomly pointing an AR-15 style rifle at people. Trudeau said he first thought it was a cap gun, but then realized it was much too loud.

Trudeau said he knows what an AR-15 rifle is because his father owns one and he has shot one on multiple occasions. He described this rifle as black with a scope on top and a handle near the barrel. He said he did not see any other weapons. He told me he got down on the ground after he heard the first shot and then heard six to seven more shots. Trudeau said he thought the shooting suspect may have yelled something, but could not understand what he said. He told me the shooter moved to the east side of the mall in front of the Macy's store and then he lost sight of him.

He told me he noticed a white male, approximately 50 or 60 years old, laying on the ground near a kiosk by Macy Home Store. He said the male had a lot of blood under his head and was gasping for breath. Trudeau said after the shooting was over he used a piece of fabric and pulled it over the lower half of the male.

Trudeau said he also noticed a female up against the door of the Best Buy door. He said he was not sure how old the female was, but said someone told him her spouse may have been with her. He said the woman had reddish-brown hair and several people said they thought she was dead.

He said he did not see any other shooting victims. Trudeau said after he saw the shooter walk past the Macy's store toward the east end of the mall, he did not see him again. He said he only heard the sound of one gun firing and only saw one person shooting. He said after he lost sight of the shooter he heard several more shots fired. Trudeau said he noticed 15 to 20



casing on the ground in the area he was. He estimated there were 50 to 100 people in the close vicinity of the area where the suspect began shooting. I ended my interview with Trudeau.

## **NARRATIVE:**

On 12-14-12 at 8:55 am Detective Chris Cate and I met with Kelly Eheler at her residence. We had talked to her son, Tyler Eheler, on 12-13-12 about this investigation and his association with Jacob Roberts. At that time we learned that Jacob Roberts had been friends with Tyler Eheler for a number of years and that Mr. Roberts had lived with the Eheler family for a period of time in the past. We also knew that Mr. Roberts was residing with Kelly Eheler's adult daughter, Jaime, at the time of the shooting incident.

Ms. Eheler told us that she had lived at her residence since 1994. She said her husband, Mark, and son, Tyler, are currently living there with her.

I asked Ms. Eheler when she met Jacob Roberts. Ms. Eheler said Tyler and Jake Roberts became friends when they were both attending Milwaukie High School. She said Tyler and Jake spent a lot of time together and often rode their bicycles around the area. She said she remembered Jake saying that his mother died from cancer when he was four years old. Jake told them he was raised by his Aunt Tammy. He said Tammy wouldn't allow him to come over to be with Tyler unless he cleaned the house and/or massaged her feet. She said Jake talked about getting money from his grandparents and he used that to buy a BMX bicycle.

Ms. Eheler told me when Tyler and Jake were about 17 years old they asked her if Jake could come to live with them. She said Jake was unhappy with his home life. She said she allowed Jake to move in but told him that if Tammy sent the police for him then he would have to leave. Ms. Eheler said she went with Jake to go pick up his belongings and she met Tammy at that time. She said Tammy was angry and yelling and told her to get off her property. She said she waited off the property for Jake to gather his things. Ms. Eheler said it was clear that Tammy did not like the fact that Jake was staying with them but Tammy never came to get him. She also heard that Tammy was a medical marijuana user due to having fibromyalgia and that Tammy had accused Jake of stealing her marijuana.

Ms. Eheler said she thought Jake had graduated from high school earlier than normal. She said she told him he would need to get a job or go to school if he was going to continue living with them. She said Jake wanted to be a wild land firefighter and obtained student loans to attend classes related to that at Clackamas Community College (CCC). At the time Ms. Eheler's daughter, Jaime, was attending CCC and was able to provide transportation for Jake. She said Jake was doing poorly in his classes and was put on academic probation which meant he wouldn't get any government funding if he failed his classes. Ms. Eheler said Jake stopped attending CCC shortly before he moved out of their home. She said Jake lived with them for approximately three years.

Ms. Eheler said Jake got a job working with gravel on Swan Island. She said he was required to work very long hours and the work was hard. She said Jake messed that job up and got fired. She said Jake wasn't working or going to school after losing that job and Ms. Eheler was pressuring him to get a job. She said Jake got a job at Big Bertha's and was working several days a week. She said he moved out and into



an apartment after he got some inheritance money. She said he bought a lot of furniture. Ms. Eheler said Jake was living with a girl who she believes was a nurse's aide.

Ms. Eheler said Jake started coming around their house again about a month ago. She said the last time she saw Jake was on Sunday (12-9-12) after they returned from a trip to Las Vegas. She said Jake was at the house playing video games with Tyler. She said Jake was supposed to be going to live in Hawaii and had a flight scheduled for while they were out of town. She was surprised to see he was still there and asked him what was up with his Hawaii trip. Ms. Eheler said Jake told her he was still planning to move to Hawaii and was scheduled to fly out on Thursday (12-13-12). She said Jake seemed happy and was laughing and having fun with Tyler while he was there.

Ms. Eheler said she believed that Jake was planning to move out of the area because he had been selling his belongings. She said Jake put his car for sale on Craigslist and he talked about meeting a guy from Vancouver who wanted to buy the car but the guy's offer was too low. I asked Ms. Eheler if she knew why Jake wanted to move to Hawaii and she said she didn't know. She said Jaime told her Jake said he wanted to be a coconut tree trimmer.

Ms. Eheler said she could have never imagined Jake hurting anybody. She said he seemed fine to her and she didn't see any signs that anything was going on since he started coming back around. She thought it could have something to do with his difficult childhood. She said Jake told her that he never had his own bedroom when he was growing up and that he had to sleep in linen closets. He told her that Tammy had different men in and out of their home all the time. Jake said Tammy stole some of his inheritance money. She said she knew that Jake liked to shoot guns but she had never seen him with a gun. Ms. Eheler said she had seen a photograph of Jake with a gun on his Facebook page.

Detective Cate asked Ms. Eheler if she knew whether Jake was drinking or using drugs. Ms. Eheler said she knows Jake was drinking after he turned 21. She said she didn't think he drank excessively. She was aware that he smoked pot and cigarettes. Ms. Eheler said Jake injured his foot some time ago and was prescribed Vicoden. She said Jake told her he felt like he was getting addicted to the Vicoden so he flushed the pills down the toilet. Detective Cate asked her if anyone in her home has a medical marijuana card and she said no. She said she isn't sure whether Tyler smokes marijuana but said he probably does.

Detective Cate asked Ms. Eheler if Jake lived with them during his marine cadet training. Ms. Eheler said no that was prior to him moving in there. She said she remembered Jake broke his foot when he was skateboarding. She said when Jake moved in his foot was healing and there were still pins sticking out of his foot at that time. She said Jake already got the news before moving in with them that he would not be able to be a marine due to the severity of his injury. She said he wasn't able to walk on it for about six months.





Ms. Eheler said she was driving home from work when she heard about the shooting at the Town Center. She said when she got home Tyler was crying and saying he thought it was Jake who did the mall shooting. She said Jaime had called to say she found some ammunition in the basement where Jake had been staying. She said she told Jaime to call the police and learned later they did report the discovery of the ammunition to the sheriff's non-emergency line.

At the direction of the case agents, I showed Ms. Eheler the attached photographs of a subject who was seen in the area of the Clackamas Town Center at the time of the shooting. I asked her if she recognized this person and she said she did not. Ms. Eheler woke Tyler and I asked him to look at the photographs and tell me if he recognized the person. Tyler said he did not.

We provided Ms. Eheler with our business cards and I asked her to contact me with any further information that she thought could be helpful to this investigation.

### **NARRATIVE:**

On December 11, 2012 at about 3:30 PM, I was in a meeting with various CCSO members including Detective Sergeant Scott Anderson. Sgt. Anderson received an audible page and advised there was an "Active Shooter" situation currently underway at the Clackamas Town Center.

I went to my cubicle and grabbed some gear and then went out to my vehicle where I put on my ballistic vest. As I was leaving the building I saw Detective Smith and we decided to ride together in my car. While enroute to the Clackamas Town Center I heard updates about the suspect's description and that people had been shot.

I entered the Clackamas Town Center parking lot near the Claim Jumper restaurant. Upon my arrival, I spoke with other Detectives who said they were tasked with blocking the entrance with their vehicles. I did the same with mine and Detective Smith and I made our way to the Command Post which was starting to form in the parking area for Tri-Met on the East side of the property.

Once Detective Smith and I made it to the Command Post we were tasked with going to the Clackamas Town Center security office to assist them in getting video of the incident that was taking place. Milwaukie PD Officer Hall joined us for this task. Detective Smith and I were able to get to the Clackamas Town Center Security office where we met with an unknown security supervisor. While inside the security office Detective Smith and I viewed surveillance tape to try and locate more information about the shooter(s). At one point we heard someone matching the shooter's description had been found deceased with an apparent gunshot wound.

I was tasked by Command to bring maps from the security office to the Command Post, which I did along with larger maps to be hung up.

I then returned to the security office and was tasked with making sure each store had been cleared by law enforcement personnel and evacuated of civilians. Detective Smith and I began this task together but then I was informed that I needed to respond to the Command Post to meet with Detective teams as I was being assigned as one of the lead investigators on the case.

After meeting with other Detectives, I volunteered to write the search warrant affidavit and returned to the office to do so. After writing the affidavit, Detective Pearson and I drove it to Judge Norby's residence and she signed it at about 12:45 AM on 12-12-12.

After getting the search warrants signed I drove to the suspect's house located at 7324 SE 84<sup>th</sup> Ave, Portland, Oregon. Upon my arrival I saw other Detectives finishing the search and decided to drive back to the Clackamas Town Center to look at the crime scene.

I arrived back at the mall at about 2:00 AM and met with Criminalist Finn, Sgt. Anderson and Detective Burlew to walk through the crime scene. Once I signed in with an unknown Oregon State Police Trooper I walked through parts of the mall with Criminalist Finn while she pointed out various items of evidence.





**ACTION TAKEN  
CONTINUED:**

On 12/11/2012 at about 1530 Hrs. I was at Aurora Airport with Deputy Shellans, standing by for an Air Unit Photo flight, to support pre-planning for an upcoming search warrant service.

The airport was weathered in, IFR conditions and we were waiting for the possibility of the low cloud ceiling lifting enough to allow us to fly.

Over the radio we heard CCOM advise of an Active Shooter incident occurring in the Clackamas Town Center Mall and requesting Deputies to respond.

As the weather did not allow us to take the department plane up and fly to the CTC area to provide aerial support, Deputy Shellans and I in our respective patrol vehicles drove to the Clackamas Town Center.

I arrived at about 15:50 hours on the south side of the town center.

At this time the available information indicated there were possibly two or more active shooters in the mall, one was down with a self-inflicted gunshot wound on the other side of the mall.

I took up a position with Deputy Miller and several Portland P.D officers on the Macy's side of the mall at the doors, at this time a white male came running at us.

Multiple firearms were pointed at him; I made the voice commands and had him lay face down on the concrete in front of the entrance door placing him in a felony take down position.

I then hand cuffed him, searched him, got him up on his feet and holding him in a restraint position walked him around a corner of the building.

I found valid ID on him, identifying the subject to be Ben Christensen.

He also had picture ID identifying him to be the manager of Just Sports inside the mall.

After verifying that he was not a suspect in this incident, I stuffed one of my business cards in his pocket, un-handcuffed him and directed him to leave via the south side parking lot.

I then entered the mall with Deputy Miller and the Portland P.D officers as a search team.

**ACTION  
CONTINUED:**

Once inside we linked up with another team, Trp. Fosburgh on this one, giving us 3 or 4 three man teams, and begin searching the first floor business(s).

I don't know how many business(s) we went thru nor what the names were.

We reached a point where the bottom floor was secure enough that citizens we had found hiding could be moved out of the store.

Making a daisy chain of officers so we could keep at least one other officer in visual range, we shuttled the civilians out of the store; I was the last one inside by the exit door.

Outside were I believe more Portland P.D officers, I had the citizens come down to me and then moved them out the exit door.

As they left I could hear the officers outside asking each person as they came out if they saw anything of the suspect(s) or incident, trying to identify any witness(s).

In groups of 4 to 15 we probably moved out about 50 or more civilians that had went into hiding in the stores.

Upon completion of this my team moved to the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor in front of Macy's to the west of the Food Court.

On the south side I saw the covered body of a male victim; on the north side across the opening to the first floor I saw the body of a white female on her back.

Deputy Joel Manley was there protecting the crime scene, I told him I would take over.

On the floor around the body of the male subject and to the east on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor were scattered empty .223 cal. Casings and several magazines.

Det. Bray ( CCSO ) was on the east side of this 2<sup>nd</sup> floor scene and identified many casings that he had identified and covered with paper folded into tents.

I looked under several large kiosk booths and found several more which I marked.

Near the body of the male and in a projection pattern to the north and north east were pieces of skull.

I marked these with CCSO Fir Cards that I got from Deputy Miller.

**ACTION  
CONTINUED:**

Looking thru the opening down to the first floor where there was a wishing well pond with water visible, I could see more bone fragments.

There were several CCSO Deputies providing security in this area, I dropped down to them more FIR cards and asked them to mark/cover any bone fragments that they could find.

I could see more in the water of the pond, but not much we could do at that point to search the pond area.

It initially appeared that the suspect had shot many times at the male victim on the south side of the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor by the front of Macy's, striking him in the head at least once killing him.

One or more bullets traveled across the mall 2<sup>nd</sup> floor and struck the female victim on the north side killing her.

Another PPD officer at my request went outside of the mall and returned with police yellow barrier tape which we put up to protect the crime scenes on the first and second floors.

I remained in this position until about 18:30 Pm when I was relieved by two ATF officers.

I then went to the Command Post by the Transit Center where I met with PPD, Criminalist Finn and Criminalist Martin, and CCSO Sgt. Naccarato ( CRAFT )

I was told that PPD would be assisting in the investigation providing their Leica 3D Scanner and personnel to operate it.

The initial plan was for Evidence Technicians to enter the mall, identify evidence, photograph and video tape.

The PPD Leica Unit and the CRAFT team scene would then obtain measurements for diagram purposes.

I left the Town Center, went to the Sheriff Office for CRAFT equipment and returned to the Command Post area.

I stood by with a CRAFT team until about 22:00 hrs. when CCSO Detectives called us into the Mall.

**ACTION TAKEN:**

At this time PPD had already set up their Leica unit on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor by the deceased male and female victims and were scanning.

As it was not necessary to duplicate their efforts there, we then examined the first floor area where the suspect had shot himself.


His body had been moved, fire arm moved, the entire hallway traveled heavily by our Explosive Experts to safeguard this scene, Deputies searching, and investigators.

It was determined that photographs and video of this scene were sufficient and a diagram was not needed.

At about 23:00 hours the CRAFT team was released from the scene.





On 03/05/13 at approximately 2:00pm I called the phone number of [REDACTED]. The call was picked up by voicemail and a male voice identified himself as "Kyle" and said to leave a message.

At approximately 3:00pm I got a return call from a male who identified himself as Kyle Kappertz.

I explained to Mr Kappertz that I was checking on the text messages between his phone and Roberts' phone. He said that he didn't know anyone named Jake or Jacob Roberts. He remembers watching some of the news coverage of the shooting incident the night it happened while at home with his mother but doesn't remember if he ever saw a picture of the suspect. If he did see a picture Mr Kappertz said it wasn't anyone he recognized because he would have been shocked that any of his friends would be involved in something like that.

Mr Kappertz said that he has had this cellular number for five or six years. He checked his phone for messages on 12/09/12 but only found two conversations he had with close friends. I provided him Robert's cell number and he checked that in his phone but didn't find any nickname matches for that number.

As the conversation was coming to a close Mr Kappertz volunteered that in early December he had been looking for a car on Craigslist and suggested maybe he was texting a seller about their ad. I asked Mr Kappertz what kind of car he had been searching for. He said mostly he was looking for 90's VW Jettas but there is a chance he could have come across something else that fit his price range and got good gas mileage. He said that after he was done with the Craigslist conversation he would normally just delete those texts no deal was made.

## **NARRATIVE:**

On December 11, 2012 at approximately 4:40pm I was asked to assist with an investigation into an active shooting call at the Clackamas town Center Mall, where two subjects were shot dead. When I arrived in the area I was instructed by Brian Schmautz to report to the command center on the East side of the mall. I met up with the CCSO Criminalist team along with Criminalists from OSP, Portland and Gresham police departments. After a short briefing to determine how we were going to process the scene it was decided that OSP would process the dead suspect and the scene on the lower level. Canby, CCSO and Gresham would process the two victims and the second level. We waited for the mall to be cleared so we could start the process of documenting the crime scene.

We formed two teams to process the second level. Greg Martin and I took the female victim while Michelle Finn and Andy Shelley took the male victim with Criminalist Finn designated as the team leader. At approximately 6:30 pm we made entry through the north entrance to the food court next to the theater. Greg Martin operated the video camera and I was assigned to take notes and be the scribe.

As we made entry to the Food Court we noticed a bullet hole at the top of an advertisement kiosk. Adjacent to the kiosk was another bullet strike in a support post. It was on the east face and caused a large fracture in the tile with debris scatter over a large area. It was labeled with the letter D. As we progressed through the mall, towards the victims, we noticed that the glass on the east side of the escalator had been shattered by a bullet. The area was near where children push carts were stored. The bullet traveled through two fabric nets on two of the child push carts and struck the glass. This was labeled with the letter H.

We moved west towards the female victim. She was lying on the tile floor in front of the Best Buy electronics store. The victim was on her back and covered by a blue blanket. There was evidence that someone had performed CPR on her. Her clothing and bra had been cut back bearing her chest. M.E. Eric Tonsfeldt was present and he removed the blanket that was covering the victim. There was a large bullet hole in the center of the victims chest. When the M.E. rolled her over we saw the entrance wound on the left side of the back.

There were shopping bags next to the victim and we believed that at least one of them may have belonged to the person who performed CPR. These bags were labeled 2 thru 4.

There was shattered glass over a large area in front and inside of the store. We found a bullet hole in a plastic sign in front of the store and struck an open glass door leading into the store. The area was examined for bullets and bullet fragments and none were found. The bullet hole was labeled with the letter A.

There was a large "MINI COOPER" sign hanging in the middle of the mall, from the ceiling, between the shooter and the victim. The sign had three or four bullet holes in it. It was determined that there was no way to determine the trajectory of the bullets. It was determined that the bullets passed through the sign from east to west about four feet high towards the victim. The area was documented and photographed.

At about 8:15pm it was reported that there may be some blood in a service hallway behind Eddie Bauer. Thinking there might be another victim Greg Martin and I investigated and it was determined that the substance was not blood. It looked to be from the handling of trash near a trash compactor.

At about 11pm it was determined that Criminalist Martin and Criminalist Finn would stay to complete the processing of the scene and Criminalist Shelley and I would go off duty so we could attend the suspect and victims post mortem examinations the next morning. I cleared the scene.

Refer to Criminalist Martin's report for additional information regarding the processing of the crime scene and the bullet holes that were found in the scene.

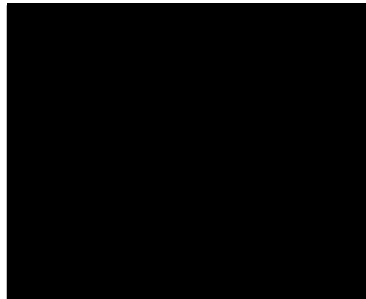

## **NARRATIVE:**

On 12/12/2012 at about 8:50am I arrived at the Medical Examiners office and met with Criminalist Shelley. At 9am I attended the autopsy of Cindy Yuille at the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Office. Dr. Christopher Young was the attending pathologist. Also in attendance were Deputy M.E. Eric Tonsfeldt, Detective Shipley, Criminalist Shelley and Dr. Nici Vance.

Dr. Vance digitally photographed the autopsy as Criminalist Shelley and I collected clothing and evidence from the decedent. See Andy Shelley's Property Report for a complete list of items collected.

I observed the decedent to have one gunshot wound which entered her back, just below her left shoulder blade, and exited her center chest. See the State Medical Examiner's report for specific details.

On 12/12/2012 at about 10:00am, I attended the autopsy of Jacob Roberts at the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Office. Dr. Karen Gunson was the attending pathologist. Also in attendance were Deputy M.E. Eric Tonsfeldt, Detective Shipley, Criminalist Shelley and Dr. Nici Vance.

Dr. Vance digitally photographed the autopsy as Criminalist Shelley and I collected clothing and evidence from the decedent. See Criminalist Shelley's Property Report for a complete list of items collected.

I observed the decedent to have a massive head wound to the top of his head. An entrance wound was located under the decedent's right ear. See the State Medical Examiner's report for specific details.

I observed the decedent to be dressed in jeans, a black short sleeved t-shirt over a black long sleeved thermal shirt and black and green Nike athletic shoes. The decedent was also wearing a black tactical or load bearing vest which was void of any type of ballistic armor. The decedent had orange colored foam style ear plugs in each ear.

One small black and silver colored flashlight was removed from the vest as well as a 30 round metal AR-15 magazine which was stamped on the bottom with a manufacture name of "ProMag". I removed and counted the ammunition from the magazine. The final count was 31 rounds of "FC 223 REM" stamped ammunition.

The decedent's ear studs, lip stud and contents of his front right pants pocket consisting of a tube of Chapstick and small change were retained by Deputy M.E. Tonsfeldt.

On 12/12/2012 at about 11:00am, I attended the autopsy of Steven Forsyth at the Oregon State Medical Examiner's Office. Dr. Christopher Young was the attending pathologist. Also in attendance were Deputy M.E. Eric Tonsfeldt, Detective Shipley, Criminalist Andy Shelley and Dr. Nici Vance.

Dr. Vance digitally photographed the autopsy as Criminalist Shelley and I collected clothing and evidence from the decedent. See Criminalist Shelley's Property Report for a complete list of items collected.

Dr. Young retrieved the decedent's jewelry and pocket contents and placed them into a bag which I marked with the decedent's name and turned over to Deputy M.E. Supervisor Phelps.

I observed the decedent to have a massive head wound to the top of his head. An entrance wound was located near the front hairline, just left of center. See the State Medical Examiner's report for specific details.

All evidentiary items were transported in the back of Criminalist Shelley's van to Clackamas County Property Control where they were locked in a secured room overnight.

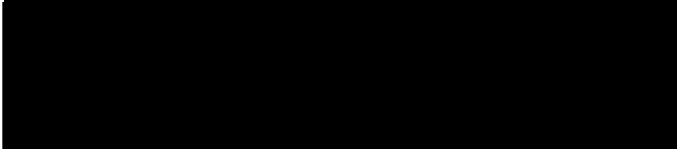

**ACTION TAKEN**

On December 11, 2012 at about 1600 hours I responded to the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office in response to an active shooter incident which occurred at the Clackamas Town Center. Responding detectives were advised to meet at the Brooks' Building where witnesses were being sent so they could provide a statement.

I spoke with Tiffany Renee Mickelson, who explained she was a Beauty Specialist that works at the Clinique counter inside of Macy's. Tiffany explained the Clinique counter is located on the upstairs level of the store, nearest to the entrance of Macy's that leads into the mall. She explained she was speaking with a co-worker, Laura Bert, when she heard what she described as a "really loud pop, like a firecracker". She said it "sounded like it was in our fragrance department", then added "it was close enough that I felt the need to run and run". Tiffany said she grabbed onto another older co-worker, Rose Kelyman, and started to run out of the store.

I asked Tiffany how she felt as the incident occurred and she said she was "scared". She added she continued to lead Rose out of the store despite being scared, just to make sure she made it out of the store safely. Tiffany said she got out of the store and grouped with several other people before they ran over to the Brooks Building.

I assisted Tiffany with coordinating a ride home, then provided her with my business card prior to concluding my contact with her.

Detectives that had originally been directed to the Brooks Building were now being directed back over to the Tri-Met parking garage at the Clackamas Town Center. I responded to the Tri-Met parking garage and met with members of the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office.

Several witnesses were being directed our way who had actually seen the suspect and could provide information regarding his actions during the incident.

I interviewed Mira Sytsma, who was a customer at the mall during the incident. Mira said she came to the Clackamas Town Center to meet a friend. She said she entered the mall by the food court and was near a kiosk (that she believed sold socks) in front of Zumiez when the incident occurred. She described she was next to the kiosk when she said she heard 2 shots fired. She said she was aware of what was happening and recognized the sound as gun fire. Mira was standing next to 3 other women at the kiosk when one ordered them all to the ground. The woman that called them all to the ground said something to the effect of her having military "experience" or military "training", so they all listened to her.

Mira said the shots sounded as if they had come from the food court area (behind her) as she was still facing the kiosk. She described as she was laying on the ground her and the other three women were using the kiosk to hide behind, on the side closest to Zumiez. She said she turned around and could see a guy laying on the ground and "twitching" just after the shots had been fired. She confirmed she didn't see the suspect shoot the male laying on the ground, but had turned and looked at him just after the shot was fired.

Mira described the shooter; male, average height and build, wearing all black with a hood over his head and wearing a white plastic mask "similar to the kind you buy at the dollar store". She described the suspect's weapon as being a "big gun" and believed it was black in color, but was not certain.

She said the suspect walked past the kiosk (she was hiding behind), and just as he walked past he turned his head towards her and saw her looking back at him around the side of the kiosk. She said he continued walking towards the other end of the mall (describing his direction as towards JC Penney).

Mira said the male employees at Zumiez said they were going to drop the gates and lock them, and yelled for Mira and the other three ladies to come inside. Mira said they entered Zumiez and joined about 20 other people for about 30-40 minutes before a police officer came and got them from inside the store. She said they were escorted outside and later asked if they were witnesses to the incident, then brought over to be interviewed by detectives.

I finished talking with Mira, then provided her with my business card and asked her to call me if she remembered additional information later.

**ACTION TAKEN**

On 12-11-12 at about 1535 hrs I learned of an active shooter incident occurring at the Clackamas Town Center. While listening to dispatch I learned multiple police officers were responding to the location and witnesses were being evacuated. I learned a mobile command post was being set up in the parking lot of the Town Center and witnesses were being sent there to be interviewed. I was responding to the mobile command post to help interview witnesses when Sergeant Young told me to respond to the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office, located just to the south of the Town Center. I was told witnesses had arrived at the Sheriff's Office and needed to be interviewed. I contacted Detective Kiesel and advised him we were needed at the Sheriff's Office.

There were multiple people gathered in a common room of the Sheriff's Office and I was told they were witnesses from the Town Center and needed to be interviewed.

I first met with Mary Sandvold. She told me she is a seasonal employee at Macys and works in the upper level clothing department. She told me she was in a back storage room sorting some clothing when an employee asked her to come to one of the cash registers to take an employee survey. She said the cash register they were at is located on the upper level of Macys and near the middle of the store, next to the ladies purse display.

She told me as she was standing next to the cash register when she heard at least five loud noises. She described the noise as a "pop sound, not a huge boom." She said the noise sounded like they were coming from the entrance to the mall from Macys, near the perfume counter. She said she could see people running in the store and could hear people yelling to "get down." She said she stayed in the store about two minutes and then left with some other employees and shoppers. She said she was not sure if she heard any additional shots prior to leaving the store. She said when she got outside she could see police arriving and she walked to the Sheriff's Office with the other people from the store. She said she did not see any part of the shooting and only heard the gunshots. She did not have any addition information at that time and I asked her to contact me if she remembered anything else.

When I was finished interviewing Mary I spoke with Brian Schmautz. He told me additional Detectives were needed at the mobile command post to help interview witnesses. I left the Sheriff's office and responded to the Town Center. I met with Officer Scharmota, and while walking through the parking lot of Macys, we were flagged down by Patricia Jones. Patricia told me she was inside Macys when the shooting occurred and stated she left some personal property inside and was wondering when she could retrieve it. During my conversation with Patricia she told me she witnessed an individual carrying a rifle just prior to the shooting.

I continued an interview of Patricia and learned she is an independent contractor that sells jewelry inside Macys. She said she has multiple displays inside that store and she is responsible for displaying product and ensuring the shelves are adequately stocked. She said she travels to various shopping centers that sell her product and arrived at the Town Center Macys at about 1500 hrs. She said she had been at Macys for about thirty minutes and was arranging her product on a display rack. She said the rack was on the upper level of the store and next to the main aisle that leads to the mall entrance from Macys. She said she was focusing on her work when she heard a person running. She said she looked up and saw an individual running from the south entrance of Macys, through the store, and toward the mall entrance. She said the individual ran in front of her down the main aisle toward the mall. She said the individual appeared to be a male and she could see he was wearing a white mask that she described as a "kids Halloween mask." She said as he ran past her she could see he was holding a rifle with both hands. She said he was holding the rifle with the barrel pointed up and was holding it diagonally across his torso. She said the rifle was black and did not have the traditional wooden stock. She said, "It was not a hunting rifle. It was something that is supposed to be illegal." She said the male passed her and she could see him from behind as he ran to the mall. She said she could see he had dark hair and the mask was bigger than his face, explaining it stuck out from both sides of his face. She said he had a thin build and was almost six feet tall.

She said she was in shock and froze in place. She said about ten seconds later she heard what she believed to be gun shots. She said she heard about six shots and she then got on the floor to hide. She said she could hear someone asking to call 911 and could hear people screaming. She said she tried to call 911 multiple times but was unable to talk to anyone. She said she was able to make it out of Macys and waited in her vehicle as police arrived, and was then contacted by me. I provided Patricia my card and asked her to call if she remembered anything else.

After talking to Patricia I went to the mobile command center to assist with any additional interviews. While there I spoke with another witness, Melissa Honey. Melissa told me she was at the mall that afternoon with her boyfriend, Christopher Sieveking. She said they were eating lunch in the food court on the upper level and were seated at a table near the top of the escalator. She said while they were sitting there she heard three rapid gunshots, a slight pause, and then about five more rapid gunshots. She said she got on the floor and hid under the table. She said she could hear glass breaking and could hear other people screaming. She said she did not see the person shooting, or if there was more than one shooter. She said Christopher grabbed their belongings and they left through the exit near the cinema. She said they didn't know what to do next, so they went to Burger King just north of the mall. She said they returned to the Max platform to get a ride home and were asked by police officers if they witnessed the incident and they said yes. She said they were asked to stay at the location until they could be interviewed, which they did. She told me she did not have any further information and I asked her to call me if she remembered anything else.

After finishing the interviews assigned to me I assisted in locating the suspect's vehicle and then cleared the scene with this report.

Ms. North said Jacob worked at the Big Bertha Gyro shop on Hawthorne for the owner named Tommy.

She described a good relationship with Jacob but he randomly told Ms. North the Thursday before last that he was moving to Hawaii. The Sunday before last they had agreed to meet up but Jacob never showed. Ms. North said Jacob's phone number was (503) 964-3981 and that was his only phone. She described it as a newer smartphone. As far as social media was concerned, Ms. North said Jacob only used Facebook.

Ms. North told me that Jacob was supposed to purchase the gyro shop from his boss but instead his boss sold it to someone else. Jacob was disappointed about that but decided to move to Hawaii because of that reason and an inheritance from his Grandpa. Ms. North could not provide me any information about Jacob's Grandfather.

Ms. North said Jacob's mom died when he was 3 and his Dad is completely out of the picture. Ms. North said Jacob's aunt raised him but he moved out and started couch hopping at about age 14. Jacob told Ms. North that he did not want anything to do with his Aunt. He described to Ms. North historical physical abuse between the two of them.

I asked Ms. North who Jacob's closest friends were. She said his best friend was Tyler Ehler. Ms. North also provided me with a couple other names of his ex-girlfriend's.

Ms. North said Jacob had a green Jetta while they were dating. She just assumed he was in Hawaii now, before she saw this incident on the news.

Ms. North said Jacob was a normally happy and very non-violent person. When they recently spoke, Jacob was crying and said he was "lost." Ms. North said Jacob sometimes tried to break up fights while he was at work but would not initiate them. He told her that when he drinks tequila he gets violent.

Ms. North said Jacob was a heavy drinker and that he drank every night that he would work and smoke marijuana on occasion. Ms. North was aware of previous cocaine and ecstasy use by Jacob.



I asked Ms. North if Jacob was on any medications and she did not think so. She also did not know if Jacob saw a DR regularly. Ms. North never saw anything from Jacob that made her think he had mental health issues.

As far as Jacob's plan for Hawaii, he told Ms. North that he would sell his possessions on Craigslist, buy a plane ticket, and live at a hotel in Hawaii before he got a place. He relayed to Ms. North that he needed to go now and could not wait for her to earn money to come with him.

Ms. North said Jacob and Tyler would play Call of Duty type video games online. She said he did not play a lot, just sometimes.

I asked Ms. North if there was anything in their 3 month relationship that she saw as a "red flag" knowing what she now knows. Ms. North said his drinking was always an issue for her including times he would drive drunk home from work.

Ms. North described to me that Jacob loved adrenaline filled activities like skydiving and that he wanted to be in the military and be a smoke jumper.

Ms. North does not know if Jacob owns firearms but she has seen a lot of handgun ammunition with Jacob. She said he has pictures of him shooting guns on his Facebook page. Ms. North was unaware if Jacob had any "long guns."

I asked Ms. North if Jacob had any masks in his possession. She described a mask that Jacob got for Halloween and showed me a picture of it. I took a picture of her phone with my phone and later printed out the picture to include with this report.

Towards the end of the interview, I asked Ms. North to help me complete a General Assessment Questionnaire that was put together by the FBI. I later placed that completed questionnaire into CCSO Evidence.


At the end of the interview, Ms. North gave me her phone which was examined by CFU ET Gotter. I have placed the data CD and consent to search card into CCSO Evidence.

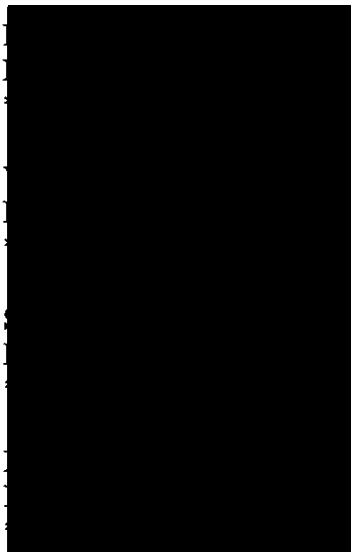

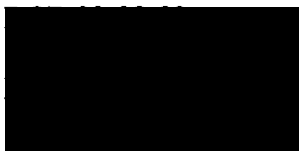

**NARRATIVE:**

On 12-18-12 at about 2:29 PM, Detective Cate and I spoke with Hannah Sansburn at her home on SE Fuller Rd in Milwaukie. It was my understanding that Hannah is a recent ex-girlfriend of Jacob Roberts.

Hannah told me she met Jacob at his birthday party this year which she was invited to by a co-worker of hers named Cody McBride. She described Jacob as shy at first but she later found out he was very out-going.

Hannah told me it was "love at first sight" with Jacob and she went home with him the first night she met him. She said they starting "dating" on April 1. Hannah said they broke up in August because she was nervous that Jacob was going to propose to her and she was nervous about that level of commitment.

Hannah said she re-initiated communication with Jacob about 2 weeks ago when she sent him a picture message of a speeding ticket she received. She and Jacob hung out on the next day, Dec 5<sup>th</sup>, spending the night with him.

On December 6<sup>th</sup>, Jacob told Hannah about his plans to go to Hawaii. She said, despite her best efforts, she was unable to talk him out of it. She told me Jacob has always loved Hawaii but he had never been there. She knew something was "not right" and that he seemed different. Hannah thought that the Big Bertha sandwich shop owner not selling the business to Jacob would "break his heart" but it did not. She said he was very happy about some things but said there was nothing left in Portland for him.

Hannah described Jacob as being different on December 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>. She described him as "numb" but not depressed. I asked her to define "numb." She said that Jacob is an enthusiastic person but this time he just sat on the couch and didn't joke around.

On December 9<sup>th</sup>, Jacob told Hannah that he got drunk and missed his flight to Hawaii on December 8<sup>th</sup> and re-scheduled for December 10<sup>th</sup>. He told her he was visiting his friend "Sam" in Hawaii.

When I asked about Jacob's aunt, Hannah said that Jacob hated her. She said that Jacob's aunt is a "druggie" and took Jacob's familial inheritance money. She said Jacob's aunt also called the police on him multiple times in an attempt to get him in trouble.

Hannah said that Jacob really wanted to be in the military but he hurt his foot which disqualified him.

I asked Hannah about Jacob and his use of guns. She said he went target shooting on occasion and she thinks he sold 2 guns at NW Armory. She said he was not obsessed with guns and he kept his guns in a safe.

Hannah said she and Jacob had a great relationship and were together almost every day doing outdoor activities like rafting, hiking, camping and going to the beach.

Hannah did not think Jacob was on any medications and she did not know of any mental health history. She said he smoked marijuana 2 times/week and drank at least 5 days/week.







**SUMMARY**

On December 11th, 2012, at about 3:29 pm, Jacob Tyler Roberts began actively shooting people inside of the Clackamas Town Center Mall. He shot three people near the inside entrance to Macy's on the second floor of the mall. Two victims were killed. One victim sustained non-life threatening injuries and was transported to OHSU. Jacob Roberts died of an apparent self-inflicted gunshot to the head during the incident. Clackamas County SO was designated as the lead agency and the Oregon State Police provided on-scene investigative resources.

As part of this investigation I coordinated the interviews of civilians identified as witnesses to the shooting.

**ACTION TAKEN**

On December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2012 at about 3:30pm I was in my office at the Oregon State Police, Portland Patrol Office in a meeting when I was informed by a patrol trooper that there had just been a shooting at the Clackamas Town Center. I turned my portable radio to CCOM net 1 and began monitoring the event while driving to the Town Center lot towards the Macy's entrance where I learned the shooter was last seen. A description of the shooter had been broadcast over the radio by dispatchers.

I arrived in the North side of the lot at about 3:35 pm, near the entrance to the theater and noted a large number of people who appeared to be mall patrons running from the exits past my vehicle. I put on a marked tactical police vest in order to identify myself as a police officer and called out to several groups exiting the mall and asked if anyone had seen anything. During this period of time I could hear that several armed entry teams had already gone into the mall. I also noted a large uniformed police presence on the side of the mall that I was on and CCSO deputies were coordinating scene containment efforts.

Detective Rhodes arrived at about the same time as I did and I asked her to assist me in identifying potential witnesses coming out of the mall. Several people we spoke with said that they did not see anything, but a few did. I asked the individuals who said that they did see something to stay and provide information as to how to get ahold of them to Detective Rhodes and took a brief statement from several of them to gauge their value as witnesses. I identified two individuals I spoke with (Antonio Frazier and Joel Holodynski) as being very important eye-witnesses to the shooting. During this time, I learned from my radio that the shooter was deceased inside of the mall and that there was no indication that there was a second shooter at that time.

I interviewed one of the two people I identified as important witnesses, Antonio Frazier, in my car and Detective Rhodes interviewed the other, Joel Holodynski (see statements section for details). After their interview, Detective Rhodes and I made our way to the Transit station on the East side of the mall where a command post was being established. I entered the command post just as a briefing was getting underway. After the briefing I spoke with Lt. Babst who informed me that some hasty witness interviews had occurred, but that the current plans involved witnesses being shuttled by bus to the Sheriff's office to be interviewed there by detectives. We agreed that this was not the most efficient manner in which to coordinate the interviews of potentially hundreds of people and so Lt. Babst asked me to find a more efficient method of doing this and also

to locate another on-site location for the interviews. She asked me to coordinate the witness interview process and informed me that Brian Schmautz and some MCT detectives were enroute to the Sheriff's Office and were awaiting instruction. I told her that I would coordinate this and left the command post.

I contacted Detective Dan Kraus and informed him of what I had been asked to do. I spoke with a Tri-met officer who indicated that there were several rooms within the Tri-met office (which was very close to the command post) which we could use for interviews. I asked several Tri-met officers, who had been tasked with directing witnesses to waiting Tri-met buses, to instead direct them to a location of a parking garage near the entrance to the Tri-met offices. I asked them to remove all witnesses on the Tri-Met buses and direct them to the same location. I contacted Brian Schmautz by phone and informed him of the plan and asked that he and any investigators who were at the Sheriff's office respond to the Tri-Met office.

I began triaging groups of mall patrons who were led into the garage structure by uniformed police officers. I triaged potential witnesses by asking them the following four questions:

- 1) Did you see the shooter?
- 2) Did you see any shell casings, magazines, firearms in any part of the mall during the incident?
- 3) Did you see any injured or deceased persons during this incident?
- 4) Did you see anything else that could be considered evidence or that you feel is important to the investigation during this incident?

I assigned Detective Floyd (Canby PD) to identify and record all current contact information for those individuals who said 'no' to all four questions. If an individual said 'yes' to any of the questions, I directed them to another line where I asked them to wait to be contacted and interviewed by the next available detective. I directed detectives to take these individuals back, one at a time into the Tri-Met offices and interview them. Several dozen detectives from OSP, the Clackamas County Interagency MCT, and the Clackamas County SO continued to trickle in to assist and interviews continued in this manner for several hours under my direction.

After the bulk of the interviews were assigned, I made contact with a separate, investigator's command post which was being staffed by Lt. Babst and Sgt. Anderson. For the next several hours I assisted them in assigning leads and follow-up to OSP and MCT investigators.

I cleared the command post and scene at about 1:45 am.

I attended an 11 am briefing at the Sheriff's Office the next day (December 12<sup>th</sup>) and received several dozen tips which I assigned to Detectives Wilson, Huskey and Schott (see their reports for more detail). I continued to monitor the progress of the detectives who were assigned leads for the next several days and serve as a liaison between those supervising the investigation at the Clackamas County SO.

**STATEMENTS:**

Antonio Frazier told me that he works at Tilley's in the mall. He said that, after he got off work (at about 3:30 pm) he went upstairs to the inner entrance to Macy's. He said that he walked about ten feet into the store when he heard "loud shots going off". He said that it sounded loud and close "like a cannon". He said that he turned around and looked towards the entrance that he had just passed by. He said that he saw a guy with either a M16 or M4 rifle firing down the hallway in the store. He described the individual as follows:

- About 5'8" to 5'10" tall
- Wearing a black long-sleeve shirt (possibly a hoody)
- Wearing a white mask which he described as a 'Jabberwocky' mask that he had recently seen on the show '*So you think you can dance*'. He said it was a flat, white, expressionless mask.
  - o Note: When searching the Internet for this mask I found several similar looking photos of the mask that Antonio described. I printed one of these photos for reference and it is attached to this police report.
- He said that the man was wearing black or dark colored pants
- He said that the man had medium length black hair which he could see coming out from under the mask

Antonio said that he heard one shot before he turned around and spotted the man. He estimated that the man was standing about 15 feet away from him. He said that he saw the man fire several other rounds while the man was standing in the hallway between the railing and the entrance to Macy's. He said that the man was pointing his gun in the direction facing to the left as one looks out into the mall from Macy's. He said that the man was definitely pointing his gun at, and shooting at people. He said that he saw more than one person fall to the ground, but couldn't see if they had been hit by a bullet or not. He said that he only witnessed the shooting for a moment, and then became afraid for his life. He said that he ran back in the direction of the outside entrance to Macy's (away from the shooter). He said that he didn't see the shooter after this.



ACTION TAKEN:

On December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2012, at approximately 3:30pm, I was on duty when I received the information via dispatch of the active shooter situation at the Clackamas Town Center Mall. I responded from NE Airport Way and NE 181<sup>st</sup> Ave and arrived at the mall at approximately 3:53pm.

I entered the lot and parked near the REI store on the south side of the mall. I saw Senior Trooper Hansell leaning into the back of a vehicle talking with a female. The female, later identified as Shevchenko, Kristina V., DOB: 10/15/97 was sitting upright in the back of an SUV talking to Senior Trooper Hansell. Senior Trooper Hansell was trying to assess Shevchenko's injury. Senior Trooper Hansell then told me Shevchenko had been shot.

At that time, I turned around and noticed a fire truck and incident command truck just pulling into the parking lot. I motioned for them to come to our location which they did. The Clackamas County Fire fighters took over assessing the extent of Shevchenko's injuries. I was then told by Clackamas Fire they were setting up a triage area on the lower level outside between the REI Store and the Duck Store at the bottom of the escalator.

Myself and a Sandy Police officer provided security at the triage scene while watching the various mall entrances/exits within our line of sight. I remained in the main parking lot adjacent to the south side of the mall until approximately 6:30pm providing security within the perimeter and escorting individuals from the main mall exits to the edge of the perimeter.

**ACTION TAKEN:** On December 11, 2012 at about 3:30 PM I overheard Senior Trooper Bob Fosburgh say over our radio that the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office was reporting an active shooter at the Clackamas Town Center. Almost immediately afterwards I heard Trooper Paul Geark running through our squad room yelling the same information as left to get into his patrol car.

I immediately left the Portland Patrol Office and proceeded to the Clackamas Town Center arriving at 3:35 PM. While en route I heard that the suspect was in the mall shooting and was possibly in the Macy's store.

I parked my vehicle next to the REI store on the Southside of the mall and grabbed my Department issued AR-15 rifle. As I began to enter the lower mall entrance between Macy's and Barnes and Noble, I had an unknown woman run up to me and tell me she was with Macy's security. She told me the shooter was dressed in dark clothing and was in a back utility room in the mall.

I entered the mall and joined up with the numerous other officers from various agencies that were entering the building.

I initially formed a team with Clackamas County Sheriff's Deputy Lon Steinhauer and Oregon State Police Detective Elijah Preston. We made our way into the lower level of Macy's Home searching for the suspect and we eventually took up a position near the escalators while other teams searched the store. While inside the Macy's Home store I was advised by Deputy Steinhauer that deceased shooting victims had been located by officers on the upper level of the mall. Deputy Steinhauer also told me that the suspect had been located deceased. At this time it was still unknown if there was more than one accomplice in this shooting so we continued with our search of the mall.

We later were joined by Senior Trooper Bob Fosburgh, who assisted us with searching the storerooms and stairwells of Macy's Home where we did not locate any items of evidence, victims or people that were hiding.

Also while at the mall, I searched the lower level of the store, Forever 21, which is immediately to the east of Macy's Home Store. I was assisted by another officer, whose name I did not notice at the time. During our search we found at least two employees hiding behind some boxes in a storeroom and several customers hiding in the dressing room none of whom were injured.

I eventually cleared the interior of the mall at about 5:45 PM and I cleared Clackamas Town Center at 6:16 PM.

I responded from my residence in a marked OSP patrol vehicle, and arrived at the mall at about 5:00pm. I parked near the parking garage on the east side of the mall complex, and was cleared from the mall after a short time to patrol SE 82<sup>nd</sup> Avenue.

At about 6:10pm, I was contacted by phone by Lt. Hershman, who asked me to return to the mall to maintain the crime scene log. I arrived back at the mall at 6:40pm.

Beginning at 6:50pm, I maintained the crime scene log for all personnel entering or exiting the mall at the movie theater entrance. When I arrived, Deputy Lister had begun the log, and he gave me the log he started.

While I maintained the log, officers from various agencies who had responded to the initial report of the shooter exited the scene. For these officers who arrived prior to the start of the crime scene log, I recorded their exit time, and wrote an arrival time of "already in," or recorded an approximate time, if they were able to remember. When an approximate time was used, I marked this with an approximate symbol (~). I also checked some teams of officers out as a group, such as the OSP and FBI SWAT teams, and a group of about 25 uniformed Portland Police Bureau officers.

While maintaining the log, I was relieved for short breaks by Lt. Hershman and Lt. Fox. On these breaks or while maintaining the log, I did not leave the food court area. At 4:00am on December 12<sup>th</sup>, I was relieved by Deputy Buzza, and I gave him the crime scene log. I cleared from the mall at 4:07am.

**SUMMARY:**

On December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2012, at about 3:29 pm, Jacob Tyler Roberts began actively shooting people inside of the Clackamas Town Center Mall. He shot three people near the inside entrance to Macy's on the second floor of the mall. Two victims were killed. One victim sustained non-life threatening injuries and was transported to OHSU. Jacob Roberts died of an apparent self-inflicted gunshot to the head during the incident. Clackamas County SO was designated as the lead agency and the Oregon State Police provided on-scene investigative resources.

As part of this investigation I interviewed witnesses to the shooting.

**ACTION TAKEN:**

On December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2012 at approximately 3:50 PM I, along with Oregon State Police Detective Aaron Jackson, responded to a report of a person actively shooting people inside the Clackamas Town Center Mall in Clackamas County, Oregon.

At approximately 4:00 PM we arrived on scene. We responded to the Command Post located near the Trimet Transit Office near the Clackamas Town Center Mall. I met with Sergeant JON HARRINGTON and he assigned me to interview witnesses to the shooting.

At approximately 4:54 PM I interviewed MARLO ZIRKLE at the Trimet Transit Office in the parking structure near the mall. She stated in substance that she went to pickup her check at the mall, left the mall to cash it and then came back. She went to The Ram for happy hour at about 1:00 PM. She then came into the mall alone through the entrance between Macy's and Phagans. She had just come in when she heard quite a few shots. She saw a body on the ground and broken glass in front of Best Buy (across from the Made in Oregon store). There was blood everywhere. She said a security guard had

brought her into the food court to calm her down and then brought her outside. She said she had a picture of the body in front of Best Buy on a cell phone. She had seen someone in a white, Jason-like mask run by her going towards Sears after the shots. She said there were people running in all directions.

At approximately 5:11 PM I interviewed MEGAN ROCHA at the Trimet Transit Office in the parking structure near the mall. She told me in substance that she had just gotten to the mall about 10 minutes earlier with her friend, Jenna. They parked in front of Nordstrom and went into the mall through Nordstrom. As they were walking to the restroom in the food court, her friend Jenna said there was someone with a mask trying to scare a group of 7 or 8 kids. She glanced quickly, but didn't see anything. They used the restroom and then went into Tilly's (on the same side of the mall as Macy's). She heard a shot upstairs and it was close, approximately 20 feet away. She grew up around guns so she knew what a gunshot sounded like. Five shots went off and then she heard a couple more being fired. The guy in the store told her to run to the back of the store. There were approximately 15-20 people in the back room of the store and the manager watched the security camera the whole time.

At approximately 7:21 PM I interviewed MARK HAKE JR. at the Trimet Transit Office in the parking structure near the mall. He stated in substance that he started work at GameStop in the mall at noon. GameStop is 3-4 stores from Sears. He heard 3-4 shots and didn't think anything of it at first. Approximately 10-15 seconds later he heard 9-10 shots. People were running by saying shots were fired. He locked up the store with a few customers inside. He let a few people leave through the Sears exit and then escorted a female with a child towards the food court as he was directed. That was when he saw people upstairs performing CPR on someone near Best Buy and there was glass and a lot of blood on the ground. He went back to the store and was locked in the store for approximately 20-30 minutes. He didn't see anyone or anything suspicious at any time.

At approximately 8:13 PM I was attached with Detective Patti Rhodes to continue the investigation. Refer to her report for further details.

After the incident, the audio recordings of the interviews were copied to disc and entered into evidence at the Oregon State Police — Portland Area Command. Refer to the attached Oregon State Police Property Report.

**Summary:** On December 11<sup>th</sup>, 2012, at about 3:29 pm, Jacob Tyler Roberts began actively shooting people inside of the Clackamas Town Center Mall. He shot three people near the inside entrance to Macy's on the second floor of the mall. Two victims were killed. One victim sustained non-life threatening injuries and was transported to OHSU. Jacob Roberts died of an apparent self-inflicted gunshot to the head during the incident. Clackamas County SO was designated as the lead agency and the Oregon State Police provided on-scene investigative resources.

### **Action Taken:**

On December 11, 2012, at approximately 3:45PM, I responded to the area of the Clackamas Town Center Shopping Mall for the report of a multiple homicide that had taken place inside.

Upon arrival I was tasked with interviewing witnesses to the event:

**Martin Wilkinson** (JC Penny's Store Employee): Mr. Wilkinson stated that he was an employee of JC Penny's, and he was going up the escalator near the top of the mall entrance. Mr. Wilkinson stated that he heard "a large boom," and then saw people "hitting the ground, and running in all directions."-----

Mr. Wilkinson said that he then ran the other way away from the loud noise. Mr. Wilkinson exited the building, and ran to the parking garage. I asked Mr. Wilkinson if he had seen anyone firing gun, and he stated that he had not.

**Daisy Fuimaono** (Clackamas Town Center Security): Ms. Fuimaono stated that she was working as a security officer inside Clackamas Town Center, and was in the food court next to Seattle's Best, and Macy's. Ms. Fuimaono said that she was helping a male customer and that as he walked off after their conversation, she heard a shot fired. Ms. Fuimaono said that she looked towards the area that she heard the shot, and she observed a male subject wearing all black clothing, and a white mask over his face.

Ms. Fuimaono said that she broadcasted over her radio, "shots fired," and then began to tell people around her to "get out of there." Ms. Fuimaono described the shoot as being "between 5-8 and 5-10, approximately 165 pounds, and he held a rifle in front of him." Ms. Fuimaono described the rifle as, "a big black gun."

I asked Ms. Fuimaono if she saw the subject raise the weapon up and fire it at anyone, and she responded, "Yes sir." Ms. Fuimaono believed she heard and saw him fire at least five shots when he did this. Ms. Fuimaono said that one of the shots flew by her, and she observed the shots hit at least one person close by to her. Ms. Fuimaono further described the suspect as wearing a "black hoodie, and black pants."

Prior to the subject commencing firing at subjects in the mall, Ms. Fuimaono did not notice him.

**Jarrold Schafer** (Macy's Loss Prevention Officer): Mr. Schafer stated that he was in the loss prevention office on a conference call when he suddenly received numerous phone calls reporting that someone was shooting at people inside the mall. Mr. Schaefer stated that they then observed a male subject on one of the security cameras carrying a gun. Mr. Schafer described the gun as an "assault rifle, or an AR-15."

Mr. Schafer said that they started to evacuate the store, and they began to review the security video for the store. Mr. Schafer said that they observed a white male adult, dressed in black clothing, wearing a white mask, carrying what looked to be and AR-15 rifle; enter into Macy's from the south parking lot doors.

Mr. Schafer said the subject entered the store quickly, and proceeded to run through it straight to the mall interior. Mr. Schafer said that they observed people dropping to the ground and hearing shots fired as they watched the reply of the video. Mr. Schafer said that the shots were fired outside in the mall area, and not in the Macy's facility.

Mr. Schafer stated that further review of the video showed a delay of "two to four minutes," then the subject passes in front of the camera a second time. Mr. Schafer said that the subject "pauses, drops a clip, and reloads the weapon." Mr. Schafer said that the subject then moved off camera, further into the mall at this point.

**Tammy Roberts** (Mother of Jacob Roberts): Ms. Roberts was located at her home residence, and she stated that she was willing to talk to me about her son. Ms. Roberts said that she had not spoken with her son Jacob for "approximately four years." Ms. Roberts was not aware of where her son was, and gave a very vague description of where he was likely living.

Ms. Roberts said that the last she had heard, Jacob had a job at a Gyro restaurant located somewhere on Hawthorne Boulevard, in Portland, Oregon. Ms. Roberts said that she did see her son walking through the parking lot of the local Winco store, but he chose not to acknowledge her.

Ms. Roberts described her son as being adopted from her deceased sister. Ms. Roberts said that she did not know of Jacob getting in to any trouble, and she was concerned that we were unable to locate him. Ms. Roberts had a tattoo on her arm that she said matched a tattoo that was on Jacob's arm. Ms. Roberts could give no further accurate information as to the location of her son.



On December 12, 2012, further follow up investigation was conducted with the following witnesses to the previous event:

**Don Funrue**, (Direct eye-witness): Mr. Funrue stated that he was on the upper deck of the food court, and was overlooking Macy's. Mr. Funrue said that he saw a man in a white mask with a gun walk into the food court, and proceed to fire "three shots." Mr. Funrue said that the subject "pointed the gun at us," but he was not sure if he fired it or not. Mr. Funrue said the glass of the railing was hit what he assumed was a round from the gun.

Mr. Funrue stated that his wife and daughter were in the basement of Macy's at the time of the shooting. Mr. Funrue described the shooter as wearing all black clothing, and "shooting the rifle from the hip." Mr. Funrue said the subject walked away from the food court and continued to fire shots as he was leaving. Mr. Funrue said the subject was not running at this point, and was moving with very methodical method.

**Joseph Lombardo** (Known associate of suspect): Joseph Lombardo stated that Jacob Roberts had called him at approximately 8:00AM on December 12, 2012. Mr. Lombardo said that Jacob told him, "He was sick of the world, and was going to take care of things." Mr. Lombardo said that Jacob stated, "If you want to stop me, meet me at Macy's around 3:00PM." Mr. Lombardo then told me that Jacob Roberts had made this statement "three to four times in the past." Mr. Lombardo stated that on two previous occasions he even went down to Macy's but was unable to locate Jacob. When asked over what time period these statements were made, Mr. Lombardo stated, "about two months."

Mr. Lombardo said that he had known Jacob for approximately "two to three years," and that his contact with him was usually, "on the street." Mr. Lombardo said that when Jacob called on a cellular phone, it would always come from a blocked and unlisted phone number. Mr. Lombardo said that he was not aware of any problems that Jacob was having, and that he "seemed like a lone ranger, with very few friends."

**Ronald Joseph** (Direct eye witness): Ronald Joseph stated that he was in the parking lot of Macy's and that as he was walking back towards his automobile, he saw a man all dressed in black wearing a white hockey mask, and carrying a black rifle, running towards Macy's.

**Sascha Coursen** (Yankee Candle Employee): Sascha Coursen stated that she was walking through the food court when she heard what she thought was "shots fired." Ms. Coursen said that she turned around and saw a "six foot tall male, all in black, wearing a mask, and walking in front of Macy's. Ms. Coursen said that the subject had his "arm held out in front of him," but she couldn't see what was in his hand due to her view being blocked by the architecture in the mall.

**Carl Hay (Direct eye witness):** Carl Hay stated that he was standing in the food court when he heard shots fired. Mr. Hay said that he then saw a round fired into the glass of the escalator, and he observed a subject heading off towards JC Penny's. Mr. Hay described the subject as wearing all black.

**Case Status:** Closed/other investigation.
